QRSS Para Track and Field Experience

Last term, QRSS and Burpengary State Secondary College (BSSC) partnered to deliver the first QRSS Para Track & Field experience. This experience developed education and awareness of the support available to belong to the representative school sport community, engage purposefully in physical activity and achieve sporting success.

The day, hosted at the University of the Sunshine Coast, was supported by BSSC Year 11 Recreation Students, and provided a valuable source of information for prospective athletes, their families, and



staff. Activities were led by the <u>Sunshine Coast Spinners</u>, <u>Life Stream Australia</u> and the <u>Queensland Academy of Sport</u>. Students from schools spanning from Metropolitan areas to Bundaberg participated in a range of track and field events as well as wheelchair basketball and a sample **QAS You for 2032** testing experience.

In sport, classification is the process of categorising athletes based on an impairment and the effect it has on performance. Athletes can participate at District, Regional and State levels with a provisional level classification, however, to compete at National events, athletes must have National Level Classification.

The Year 11 students from BSSC engaged in genuine learning experiences, contributing directly to their specifically designed Recreation course, including:

- participating in events modified for students with specific needs;
- identifying specific needs of students for the events; and
- designing lesson plans to be inclusive of students.
