Grace Brimelow - 'her journey to the Paralympics'

Grace Brimelow is an 18-year-old Australian para-triathlete and swimmer from the Sunshine Coast, Queensland. Diagnosed with Cri du Chat syndrome—a rare genetic disorder affecting her physical coordination, strength, and speech—Grace has defied expectations to become one of Australia's most promising young para-athletes.

Grace's athletic journey began early, with swimming lessons at just four months old and involvement in Little Athletics by the age of five. Her passion and drive for sport flourished during her time at Sunshine Coast Grammar School, where she actively participated in school sporting events across swimming, cross-country, and athletics. Grace's talent was soon recognised by her physical education teacher, Maureen Cummings, who encouraged her to explore aquathlon and later triathlon.

She has represented her district and Sunshine Coast region in track and field, cross country, triathlon and swimming since she was 10 years old. Through school sport carnivals and interschool competitions, Grace gained the confidence and competitive experience that laid the foundation for her elite para-sport career. One the national stage, she has represented QRSS in Cross Country, Swimming and Triathlon throughout her time in the program on numerous occasions.

She has consistently competed in both para and able-bodied events, demonstrating her remarkable determination and versatility. In 2024, Grace made her Paralympic debut in Paris in the Women's PTS4 triathlon. Although disqualified due to a bike leg error, the experience deepened her commitment to international competition.

Outside of triathlon, Grace has achieved notable success in swimming. A member of the 2024/25 Swimming Australia National Para Flippers Squad, she has her sights set on representing Australia in both swimming and triathlon at future Paralympic Games.

Balancing elite sport with academics, Grace continues to train under coaches Toby Coote (triathlon) and Charles Barry (swimming) while completing her education at Sunshine Coast Grammar School. Her long-term ambition is to compete in both disciplines at the Los Angeles 2028 and Brisbane 2032 Paralympic Games.

Her story is one of resilience, talent, and the power of school sport to launch exceptional young athletes toward global success.








Celebrating National Championship Success

Student Officials Program

Queensland Representative School Sport runs a successful student official program. The student officials' program was introduced to provide an alternative pathway for students to be involved in the QRSS program in the sport of their choice as a referee or umpire. This program has continued to provide valuable learning opportunities for students across the state that they may not get in club sport. The student officials program aims to:



- Provide a pathway for all students
- Grow excellence
- Strengthen pathways
- Maximise learning

In 2024, 343 students registered to be a student umpire or referee at State Championships with 77 students representing Queensland.

This year QRSS and the regions are working closely with State Sporting Organisations to ensure students have the opportunity to officiate, receiving education and mentoring throughout the State Championships. To date, approximately 200 students have officiated.

In Semester One 2025, 66 students have been selected to attend the National Championships to officiate for AFL, Basketball, Netball, Hockey, Rugby League, Softball, Touch Football and Volleyball. This is from their efforts at the QRSS State Championships and have been rewarded with the opportunity to represent Queensland in their chosen field of officiating.

Following the resounding success of the inaugural SSA Games in 2024 on the Gold Coast, this prestigious event will once again bring together Australia's brightest young sporting talents for a week of outstanding competition and camaraderie.
