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Sport Competition Guidelines

Minimum Venue Standards

The host region venue must comply with audit requirements and:

- complete a procurement process (where required).
- have sufficient and suitable (e.g. cabin/motel style) accommodation within the host town/city to provide places for all visiting parents/supporters competitors/ student officials/team officials
- have access to appropriate transport to/from the host town/city
- have access/proximity to 24 hour medical services (e.g. hospital, ambulance, dentist, physio)
- The playing venue must be a suitable standard and must comply with the sport specific minimum requirements. Consideration must also be given to factors such as:
 - sufficient number of suitably sized change rooms present
 - spectators must be adequately catered for with suitable viewing, toilet facilities, canteen etc.
 - Competition Area – Field of Play/number of courts or fields required
 - Suitable shade & shelter for hot & wet weather if necessary
 - Access to water
 - Officials' Room with secure area for official's bags
 - Championship working group control room
 - Access to internet
 - Laptop and printer
 - Photocopier
 - Paper
 - General stationery

First Aid

A minimum of two First Aid Officers/Sports Trainers must be provided each day of competition. Any child treated must be accompanied by a Team Official or parent.

Spectator's facilities

Ensure there is sufficient shade, seating, toilets facilities, food and drinks vendors.

Officials

It is preferable that all key officials have a minimum Level accreditation and first aid/CPR. The key officials are (but not limited to):

- Tournament Director
 - Technical Convenor
 - Chief Referee
- Additional officials required (list individually)
Student Officials – insert QRSS 'categories'

Equipment

- The Host Region must supply all equipment for the safe conduct of the Championships.
- All equipment must comply with sport specific requirements
- Other necessary equipment is:
- Competition Software (if applicable)
- Access Passes (if applicable)

Competition areas must be checked each day for potential hazards and steps must be taken to rectify or make safe these potential hazards.

A pre-championship meeting, chaired by the host RSSO / Asst. RSSO, in conjunction with the QRSS-SE member in attendance shall be convened for the purpose of discussing the conduct of the championships. The convenor may also be involved in the hosting of the meeting.

Regional team lists are to be confirmed at the pre-championship meeting. No changes are to occur after the list is confirmed.

A post-championship meeting may be convened and from this meeting recommendations may be put forward for consideration by the QRSS-SE. If recommendations are endorsed by regional delegates, these must then be submitted to the QRSS-MC for approval.

All regional officials must attend all meetings and official functions as organised by the championship convenor and/or the QRSS-SE. This would include any Professional development opportunities as organised by the QRSS-SE.

Duration and Draws

Duration of championships are to be scheduled to use no more than two school days for competition. Where this cannot occur, the Host Region will communicate with the QRSS – RC and QRSS for approval and endorsement.

Such issues may include:

- availability of venues,
- number of games played per day etc

At each State Championship for team sports, the draw must ensure that all teams play on each day of the event.

At each State Championship a Queensland team may be selected and named (as a travelling or merit team). No other teams are to be named.

The sport specific competition procedures outline the draws and round robin matches to be played for various formats.

Additional teams (if required)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • U12 Crusaders. This is a team selected from students from the Cape York region. These students will be under the guidance of AFLCY staff. This team will play in the boys competition but will be eligible to have girls in their team that are still available for QLD state selection. • All other teams are decided upon using the QRSS additional team process
Sporting Organisation Support (if required)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AFLQ staff to help fill roles (TBC)
State Championship Team Officials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Team officials — At the State Championships each regional team may have 4 officials maximum consisting of: coach, assistant coach/runner, manager, trainer and water carriers (two). On warmer days, an allowance for water carriers will be permitted in consultation with carnival convener and executive. • Coaches and assistants (maximum of 4 people) of the playing teams will be restricted to occupying the Coach's bench/designated area during the playing time. • Trainers will be allowed on the field to attend to injuries. Designated runners will be allowed on the field to provide drinks for players and deliver coach's instructions. They are not to stay on the field for lengthy periods of time to 'coach' the players. They must be wearing a uniform set by the QRSS AFL Sports Executive. The trainer/runner must then retire from the field of play immediately. • All officials entering the field of play must be in the program and be registered teacher or authorized personnel.
Umpires/Referees	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student officials will be appointed to the 10-12 and 13-15 yrs Championships • Field umpires of all games shall be certified umpires appointed by the Student Official Manager in consultation with AFLQ, where possible and should be properly attired in official uniform. • All games will be umpired by a minimum of 2 central umpires, and 2 goal umpires. • If no boundary umpires are appointed a ball up will be used 15m from the boundary for out of bounds.



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Umpires will check all players before the commencement of the game for uniform compliance.
Appointment of Queensland Team Officials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The appointment of QRSSAFL state team officials is governed by the QRSS Competition Procedures. Applicants for Queensland Team positions must have attended a minimum of 2 State championships as a regional team official, championship convenor or member of the committee executive. In applying for their respective positions, all officials make the commitment to attend all set training times and/or be available to attend a team training camp.
Appointment of Selectors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The selection panel shall be determined prior to the pre- carnival meeting (organised by the host convenor) where ever possible. Selection meetings will be led by the state team coach but will be overseen by a member of the executive as chair. The selection panel must comprise of a minimum three members (QRSS state team officials and 2 independent selectors) The selectors shall meet on each day of the state carnival. The selection panel, or panel members, will meet with all coaches of competing regions at the conclusion of Days 1 and 2. Team coaches may submit a written report to selectors. At least one selector shall be present at every game during the competition. The selectors shall maintain a written record of all competition viewed and meetings held using the criteria provided. Regional team coaches/managers shall advise the chair of students not available for selection.
Announcement of the state team	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The state coach or manager will announce the team. The 10-12 yrs Boys and Girls state team will select 23 members. The 13-15 yrs Boys and Girls state team will select up to a maximum of 25 members. Shadow players may be named at the ceremony and may be invited to train with the state team. A meeting of players, parents (if present) and officials will occur at the completion of the naming of the state team.
Minimum Venue Standard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> See AFL Youth Rules and Regulations All games to be played on a standard sized oval without modification.
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Participants must be turning 10,11 or 12 in the year of competition to be eligible for the 10-12 yrs team. Participants must be turning 13,14 or 15 in the year of competition to be eligible for the 13-15 yrs team.
Participation expectations – sport specific	<p>It is recommended that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Appropriate codes of behaviour are adopted to include the teams lining up to shake hands and giving the traditional three cheers for opposition and officials. Students who are suitably qualified adopt roles as officials where appropriate on and off the field. Attention is paid to players being appropriately dressed at all times.
Playing uniform	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Players should wear the appropriate uniform for the region they represent. All players should have clearly numbered jerseys. Players should wear the same number for each game unless written notice is given to selectors prior to the match. Players may wear any football boots/shoes, although no player will be allowed to take the field with metal, aluminum or steel stops. All visible under garments, bandages, taping and thermal supports must be beige or skin tone of the wearer in colour. The use of any protective equipment including gloves must gain the approval of AFLQ prior to being worn in a match. Players who wish to wear spectacles during matches and training sessions should wear spectacles with PLASTIC FRAMES and PLASTIC LENSES. A band must also hold the spectacles securely. This will minimise the risk of injury to the player,



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	<p>teammates and opposition players. Approval to wear spectacles that do not have plastic frames and plastic lenses should be sought in writing from the Competition Manager.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Players are permitted to wear specialised garments under their playing shorts and jersey. • Players are only permitted to wear playing gloves when a medical certificate is presented by the team manager to the championship convenor.
Match equipment	<p>All match balls to be supplied by the host School Sport Australia member body.</p> <p>Ball Type/size</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All 12 Years & Under Boys and girls games to use a size 3 leather ball unless the National Australian Football Advisor decides a synthetic ball would be better. • All 15 Years & Under Boys games to use a size 5 leather ball unless the National Australian Football Advisor decides a synthetic ball would be better. • All 15 Years & Under Girls games to use a size 4 leather ball unless the National Australian Football Advisor decides a synthetic ball would be better
Team Size	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Boys – Squads of 23 max (18 players on the field at one time) 6-6-6 rule • Girls – Squads of 21 max (16 players on the field at one time) 5-6-5 rule
First Aid	<p>Each team should have an adequate first aid kit. <i>Note: water carriers during a game can only be a registered teacher or authorised personnel. A trainer and runner shirt must be worn during the game.</i></p> <p>Blood rule</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The blood and send off rules will apply for every match. <p>Concussion https://www.play.afc/globalassets/assets/clubhelp/pdf-excel-doc/management-of-sport-related-concussion-in-australian-football-25-april-2021-final-1.pdf</p> <p>Emergency procedures</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The appointed first aid officer is the designated case manager for all injuries and subsequent treatment. • The appointed first aid officer approves the player re-entering the field after initial treatment. • Regional manager is the designated liaison with the appointed first aid officer. <p>Treatment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The umpire will stop play and direct player from field, a replacement player is able to take the field immediately • A player with: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) an open cut or abrasion or (b) blood on any part of his/her body or uniform is to be removed from the field of play for treatment or cleaning (c) concussion symptoms
Spectator's facilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Ground Manager and Convenor are responsible for ensuring the safety of players and officials. • Parents – Parents are not permitted to enter the field of play. • If no fence at the venue, parents and spectators are to remain an adequate distance from the boundary of the field as requested by the Ground Manager.



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Trophies and presentations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medallions will be awarded to the top three regional teams at the conclusion of the championship. • Perpetual trophies will be awarded to the winning championship team (highest ranked team after the final on the final day). • Umpire of the 10-12yrs Championship – will be awarded to the best umpire across the championship (Student Officials Manager will select this player) • Umpire of the 13-15yrs Championship – will be awarded to the best umpire across the championship (Student Officials Manager will select this player) • The 10-12yrs King/Coker Spirit Award (funded by the committee) will be awarded to the team with the most accrued 'fair play and sportsmanship points' as awarded by the field umpires at the conclusion of each game. This award is named after two life members of the association. • Player of the Boys 10-12 yrs Championship – Jason Akermanis Medal (funded by the committee) will be awarded to the best boy player in the boys' championship (state selectors will select this player) • Player of the Girls 10-12 yrs Championship – Tayla Harris Medal (funded by the committee) will be awarded to the best girl player in the girls' championship (state selectors will select this player) • Player of the Boys 13-15 yrs Championship (funded by the committee) will be awarded to the best boy player in the boys' championship (state selectors will select this player) • Player of the Girls 13-15 yrs Championship (funded by the committee) will be awarded to the best girl player in the girls' championship (state selectors will select this player) • Regional team player awards to be presented by regional team officials and are not included in the closing ceremony.
Selection of referee/umpires to attend National Championships	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A minimum of four student officials will be selected to attend the SSA Championship for their respective division based on their performance at the QRSS AFL State Championship event.
School Based Competitions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AFL Queensland conducts a state-wide knock out competitions for both primary and secondary school aged boys and girls which is open to all schools around Queensland. • All schools are eligible and welcomed to nominate team/s. The QRSS AFL has no role in organisation of this competition.



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Championship Rules and Guidelines

Protests

Protests must be lodged with the convenor within thirty minutes of the conclusion of the game on the date of the match and shall be dealt with by the managers of the teams involved, the organising committee and a member of the QRSS Australian Football Sports Executive. This meeting will be chaired by the convenor.

The umpire in charge of a match may order a player from the field for a period of 15 minutes of playing time by use of a yellow card for:

- verbal harassment
- abusive language
- other unseemly conduct detrimental to the game
- any reportable offence according to the 'Laws of Australian Football'

Such player must report to the ground manager on leaving the field and before returning. The player will be in the control of the team manager while off the field of play.

The player sent off may be replaced immediately by an interchange player.

It shall be left to the discretion of the umpire whether the player sent off is reported.

For a second offence during the game, the player must be sent off for the remainder of the match, shown a red card and be reported. The player may be replaced by an interchange player.

The field umpire may send a player off for the remainder of the match if, in his/her opinion, that player constitutes a menace to the physical wellbeing of other players and the offence that they have committed is of a serious nature. Such a player must be shown a red card, reported and may be replaced by an interchange player.

Player reports — any umpire shall have the power to report a player for serious infringements to the championship convenor.

- A sub-committee shall be formed to discuss the report. The sub-committee shall consist of the managers of the two teams involved a member of QRSSAFL Sports Executive & will be chaired by the convenor in the presence of the umpire. This is to be conducted in a timely manner.
- The report shall be lodged / recorded within sixty minutes of the end of the game, in the presence of the umpire.
- The managers of the teams involved must table relevant documentation.

13-15 Years Boys and Girls

- The density rule applies each side must have six forwards and six defenders behind the centre square lines at centre bounces. No forwards or defenders can be along the wing lines.
- If there is a ball up around the ground or stoppage both teams have to have a minimum four forwards and four defenders in their half of the ground which means past the centre circle. Of the four from each team two forwards and two defenders must be inside the forward fifty.
- A maximum of twelve players can be used in a zone defence at kick -ins.
- No extra players to be sitting behind the football in general play. The genuine ruckman at the time is the exception to this but we do not want him sitting back there for the whole time. He needs still to be the ruckman around the ground but naturally can push back to help.
- Games shorter than the maximum should only occur when agreed upon by coaches and convenor prior to the match.



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Draft Draws

The draw is to be provided and ratified by the QRSS AFL Sports Executive prior to the championships.

The draw should be set with the intent of maximising participation rates of all players and avoiding back to back game clashes.

Host region to start the carnival as Game 1.

10-12 yrs Boys and Girls Draw

10-12 yrs Boys Draw

- The draw for the for the boy's championship will consist of a qualifying round (based on the previous year's results) to determine four groups. These pools will then be split into 3 Pools through which final positions will be decided.
- Following the conclusion of day 1 round robin group matches. The top ranked team in each group goes into pool A. The second ranked team from each group goes into pool B and the third ranked team from each group goes into pool C.
- On Day 2 and 3 teams play the other 3 teams in their pool. Teams are then ranked 1 to 4 from their Pool matches. There is an opportunity for promotion / relegation to a higher / lower pool for teams #4 in Pool A, Team #1 and #4 in Pool B and Team #1 in Pool C. This then sets the draw for the Semi-finals.
- The Finals are then played between the 2 winners from each pools Semi-finals and the 2 losers from each pools Semi-finals.
- In order to determine progression in the draw and overall positions, should there be a washout a draw will be awarded and percentage used to determine progression.
- In the event of a draw in a pool game a draw will be awarded. In the event of a draw in a semi / quarter final the higher ranked team will progress through. In the event of a draw in a playoff final a tie will be awarded.

10-12 yrs Girls Draw

- The draw for the for the girl's championship will consist of a qualifying round (based on the previous year's results) to determine two pools through which final positions will be decided.
- Following the conclusion of day 1 and 2 round robin group matches. The top three ranked teams in each group qualify for the quarter finals. The 4th and 5th ranked teams in each group qualify for the 7-10 pool.
- On Day 3 teams ranked #2 and #3 in their group play off in Quarter finals whilst Number 1 ranked teams go straight through to the Semi finals. The 2 winners of the quarter finals play the #1 ranked teams in the Semi Finals. In the 7-10 pool teams play the other 2 teams from the other group on Day 3. At the conclusion of these games teams are ranked 7-10 from all games played against the 3 other teams in their pool.
- The Finals are then played between the 2 winners and the 2 losers of Semi-finals. The 5th place playoff is played between the 2 quarter final losers. Team #7 plays team #8 whilst team #9 plays team #10.
- In order to determine progression in the draw and overall positions, should there be a washout a draw will be awarded and percentage used to determine progression.
- In the event of a draw in a pool game a draw will be awarded. In the event of a draw in a semi / quarter final the higher ranked team will progress through. In the event of a draw in a playoff final a tie will be awarded.

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Selection process and criteria

Selection Panel

- Chair of selectors
- Selectors from Regional Teams
- Additional independent selector (If required)

The chair of the selectors will be the:

- Queensland team coach or Manager
- Regional Team selectors

Additional independent selector

- An additional independent selector may be appointed if necessary.
- The IC must not be attached to any team at the competition.
- The cost of this person is included into the budget and will be included in the team levy.
- The preference is that this person is from the State Sporting organisation to ensure we continue to foster and build upon relationships

Process

Prior to the Championship

1. Queensland School Sport advertises for Team Official positions
2. Successful applicants must complete the mandatory training prior to the State Championship
3. QRSS will communicate the Chair of Selectors to each region
4. Region will send the final team lists to the Chair of Selectors
5. As part of bulletin 2, Regions will request nominations for the panel of selectors
6. Chair of selectors will complete the selectors booklet for distribution at the Pre-Championship meeting

At the Championship

1. Chair of selectors establishes a roster for each game
2. At least one member of the selection panel must be present for each game
3. Each panel member must attempt to see part of each of the games (draw permitting)
4. Regional team officials must be consulted daily regarding selection
5. Notes must be kept for each athlete wishing to be selected

- Establish the criteria
- Discuss the roster for each game

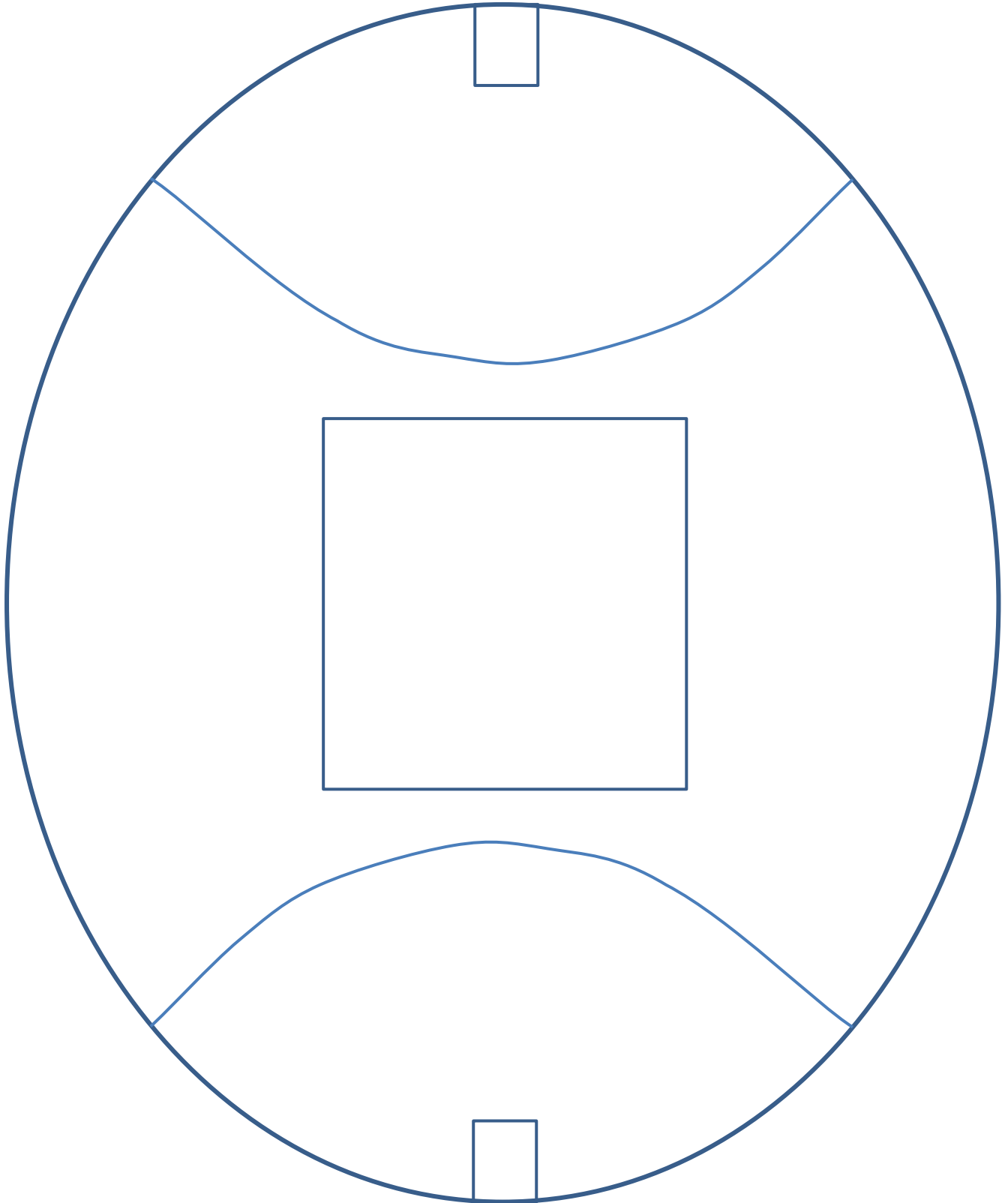

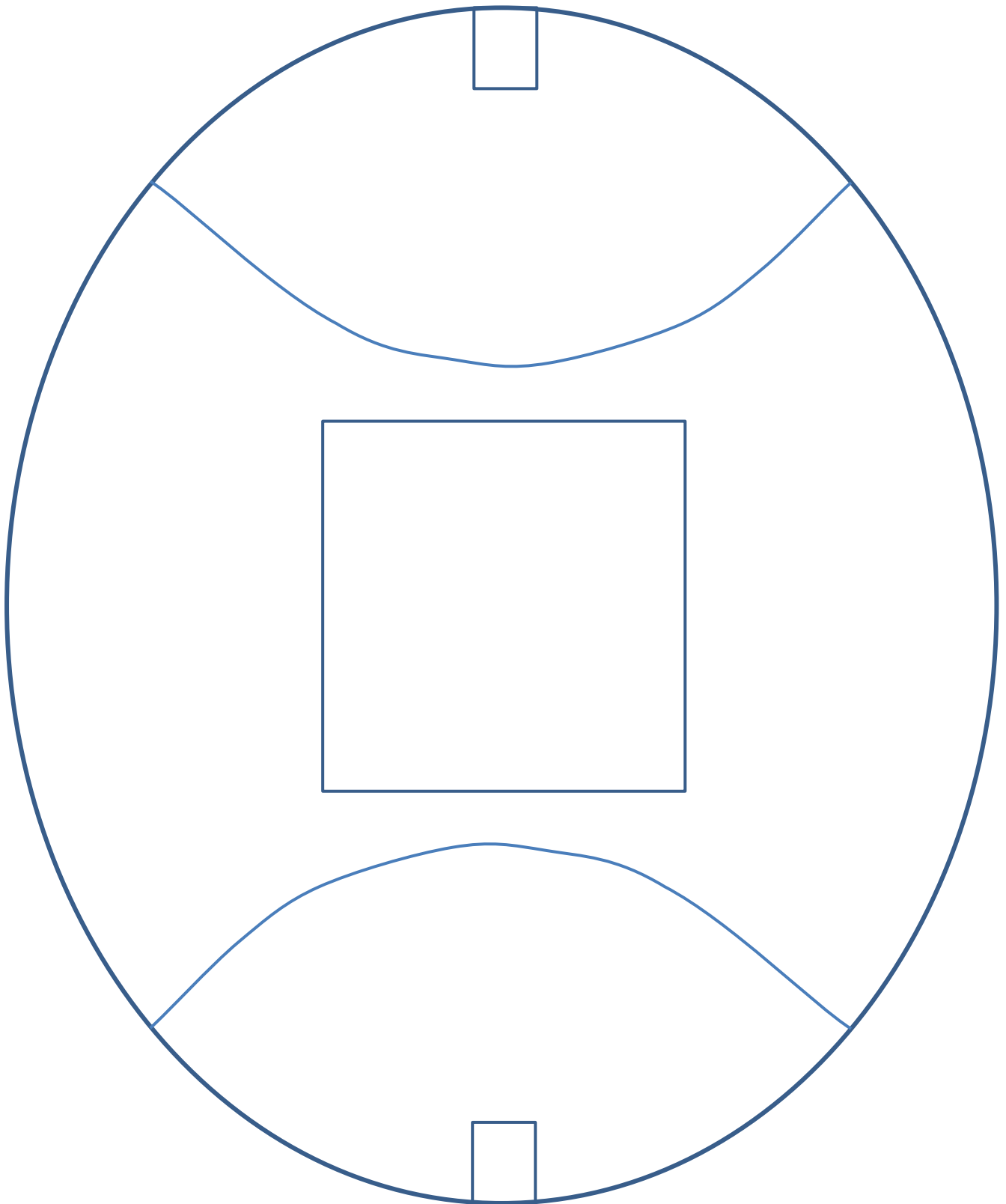
