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Sport Competition Guidelines

Minimum Venue Standards

The host region venue must comply with audit requirements and:

- complete a procurement process (where required).
- have sufficient and suitable (e.g. cabin/motel style) accommodation within the host town/city to provide places for all visiting parents/supporters competitors/ student officials/team officials
- have access to appropriate transport to/from the host town/city
- have access/proximity to 24 hour medical services (e.g. hospital, ambulance, dentist, physio)
- The playing venue must be a suitable standard and must comply with the sport specific minimum requirements. Consideration must also be given to factors such as:
 - sufficient number of suitably sized change rooms present
 - spectators must be adequately catered for with suitable viewing, toilet facilities, canteen etc.
 - Competition Area – Field of Play/number of courts or fields required
 - Suitable shade & shelter for hot & wet weather if necessary
 - Access to water
 - Officials' Room with secure area for official's bags
 - Championship working group control room
 - Access to internet
 - Laptop and printer
 - Photocopier
 - Paper
 - General stationery

First Aid

A minimum of two First Aid Officers/Sports Trainers must be provided each day of competition. Any child treated must be accompanied by a Team Official or parent.

Spectator's facilities

Ensure there is sufficient shade, seating, toilets facilities, food and drinks vendors.

Officials

It is preferable that all key officials have a minimum Level accreditation and first aid/CPR. The key officials are (but not limited to):

- Tournament Director
- Technical Convenor
- Chief Referee

Additional officials required (list individually)

Student Officials – insert QRSS 'categories'

Equipment

- The Host Region must supply all equipment for the safe conduct of the Championships.
- All equipment must comply with sport specific requirements
- Other necessary equipment is:
- Competition Software (if applicable)
- Access Passes (if applicable)

Competition areas must be checked each day for potential hazards and steps must be taken to rectify or make safe these potential hazards.

A pre-championship meeting, chaired by the host RSSO / Asst. RSSO, in conjunction with the QRSS-SE member in attendance shall be convened for the purpose of discussing the conduct of the championships. The convenor may also be involved in the hosting of the meeting.

Regional team lists are to be confirmed at the pre-championship meeting. No changes are to occur after the list is confirmed.

A post-championship meeting may be convened and from this meeting recommendations may be put forward for consideration by the QRSS-SE. If recommendations are endorsed by regional delegates, these must then be submitted to the QRSS-MC for approval.

All regional officials must attend all meetings and official functions as organised by the championship convenor and/or the QRSS-SE. This would include any Professional development opportunities as organised by the QRSS-SE.

Duration and Draws

Duration of championships are to be scheduled to use no more than two school days for competition. Where this cannot occur, the Host Region will communicate with the QRSS – RC and QRSS for approval and endorsement.

Such issues may include:

- availability of venues,
- number of games played per day etc

At each State Championship for team sports, the draw must ensure that all teams play on each day of the event.

At each State Championship a Queensland team may be selected and named (as a travelling or merit team). No other teams are to be named.

The sport specific competition procedures outline the draws and round robin matches to be played for various formats.

Sporting Organisation Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Basketball Queensland are requested to supply referees for the 13-16s and 17-19s competitions. The cost is determined via BQ quoting to supply this service at both competitions. BQ then accepts full responsibility for sourcing and managing all referees including student referees if selected by BQ.
State Championship Team Officials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each team may have a coach, assistant coach and manager. The appointment of such positions is determined by the QRSS sporting regions. • Host regions and the SEC are to ensure there are sufficient medals to cater for any regions with more than 2 team officials.
Umpires/Referees	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The minimum number of referees required at each championship is 25. • Regions are strongly encouraged to nominate suitably qualified referees through the QRSS student officials' pathway, liaising with the students' officials' manager or Basketball Qld as relevant to the specific state championship. • Refereeing throughout the championships will be under the control of a referee commissioner(s), who will also co-ordinate the provision of evaluation of and educational activities for all participating referees. • Student Officials pathway processes and procedures, including flight subsidies, will align with the QRSS Leadership Handbook policies. • A minimum of 2 referees from each of the 10-12s and 13-16s state championships are selected to represent Qld at the SSA Nationals in each SSA age category. This selection is merit based and based on performance at the state championship. Selection is co-ordinated by the Referee Commissioner(s). • The host region is to provide student official catering and uniforms as part of the state championship budget (not for BQ contracted referee events). • The Student Officials' Manager / Referee Commissioner may seek the assistance of Basketball Queensland / local basketball associations and referee associations to identify and encourage suitably qualified / skilled referees to nominate for selection as part of the QRSS student officials' program. • More adult/experienced referees are usually needed for the 17-19s state championship. • Where possible all referees at the 10-12s state championship should be student officials • As much as is practical, referees are to be evaluated on their performance on as many games as possible. Ideally, each referee would be evaluated on at



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	<p>least one game per day, depending on the availability of referee educators.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Referee Commissioner, SOM and Referee Educators are to be provided with a QRSS Event Officials shirt. (This does not apply to the 13-16s and 17-19s if BQ are contracted to supply the referees.)
Championship Technical Committee	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Technical Committee shall be composed of the championship convenor, the referees' commissioner and, if necessary, the Chair of QRSS 10-19 Years Basketball Sport Executive Committee or nominee to ensure a minimum of three members. The Technical Committee shall rule on all aspects of the competition as required to ensure the competition is conducted in line with QRSS 10-19 Years Basketball Sport Executive Committee competition procedures, FIBA rules and QRSS policy and procedures. The Technical Committee shall act as a judiciary as required. The Technical Committee will follow Basketball Australia's Disciplinary Tribunal By-law procedures. Disputes or reports are to be lodged with the championship convenor in written form within 30 minutes of the completion of a game. The championship convenor shall receive all disputes and forward them to the Technical Committee. The decision of the Technical Committee is final. Unforeseen circumstances: The Technical Committee may make changes to the playing rules in the event of extreme circumstances, e.g. equipment failure, poor weather conditions, health and safety considerations.
Appointment of Queensland Team Officials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The appointment of state team officials will align with the QRSS Leadership Handbook procedures. Ideally a Coach, an Assistant Coach and a Manager are appointed to each team. The SEC Basketball will, where possible, initiate and support a state team coaching mentoring program as part of longer-term succession planning.
Appointment of Selectors	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All regional team coaches are expected to participate in the selection process by attending state team selection meetings. A panel of selectors (min 5 which includes the state coach and assistant coach/manager and representing both pools where pools are used) will oversee all aspects of the selection process. The state coach will co-ordinate the election of the selection panel and chair the relevant state selection panel.
Announcement of the state team	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The state teams consisting of 10 players per team will be announced at the closing ceremony State team shadow players are also selected. Shadow players may also be announced at the closing ceremony if deemed appropriate. For the 10-12s state team 5 shadow players are selected. For the 13-16s state team 10 shadow players are selected. A player from outside the shadow group may be considered for call up into the state team in extenuating circumstances. Such a selection must be approved by the Chair of the Sport Executive Committee and QRSS Officer.
Minimum Venue Standard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A 4 court playing venue is preferred. However, all competitions can be run at a 3 court venue although this is not ideal re game timings. All venues must be indoor, ideally on sprung wooden floors All venues must have shot-clocks on all courts as well as suitable score-bench and team bench set-ups Breakaway rings are preferred on playing courts used for the 13-16s and 17-19s competitions. Playing venues must meet the requirements of the CARA basketball risk assessment documents. Chain nets cannot be used at any competition.
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To compete in the 17-19 years competition, players must be 17, 18 or 19 years of age as at 31 December in the year of the competition. Exemptions (ie using a younger player) may be sought based on the requirements of a particular region to fill a team, subject to their own regional policies following a risk assessment about competing in an older age group.



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To compete in the 13-16 years competition, players must be 13, 14, 15 or 16 years of age as at 31 December in the year of the competition. To compete in the 10-12 years competition, players must be 10, 11 or 12 years of age as at 31 December in the year of the competition.
Participation expectations – sport specific	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Participation expectations must align with both the QRSS Leadership Handbook policies and Sport Region expectations. Participation expectations are underpinned by the principles of equitable court time which should be communicated to all participants.
Playing uniform	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Playing uniforms are supplied by regions. Each region should ensure at least 1 blood uniform per team is available at state championships. Playing numbers and uniform specifications, including the use of 'skins', must align with FIBA rules.
Match equipment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> QRSS Basketball use Molten basketballs (to align with competitions run by Basketball Queensland and Queensland Basketball Associations). Balls to be used are the Molten BG 4000 or similar. The 10-12s use Size 6 basketballs. A minimum of 4 must be available per championship. The 13-16s and 17-19s use size 6 (girls) and size 7 (boys) basketballs. A minimum of 3 balls per size are required per championship. iPads are used for on-line scoring. If iPads are unavailable or on-line scoring is not possible, scoresheets are required. Where iPads are used, connectivity is required (iPad wi-fi). Score-bench equipment (game clock, scoreboard, stationary, possession arrow, foul paddles) is required. Blood kits must be available to clean any blood on a court Towels (or mops) are required on each court to dry the court as required.
Team Size	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A maximum of 10 players per team is allowed.
First Aid	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> First Aid policies must align with QRSS policies and procedures, including the QRSS Concussion Policy. Blood rule: As per FIBA rules a player who is bleeding or has an open wound must be substituted. S/He may only return to the court once the bleeding has stopped and the affected area or open wound has been completely and securely covered. Injury Treatment and Emergency Procedures: Required actions will be determined by the sports trainer, team coach or manager and the championship convenor. In the instance where a player is unable to be moved the championship convenor may reallocate the remainder of the game to an adjoining court where and when available.
Spectators' facilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Venues that have adequate spectator seating and vision of a scoreboard should be selected.
Trophies and presentations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A perpetual shield is presented to the winning team in each gender at each state championship. In the 10-12s championship, perpetual shields (The Daryl Argue Shields) are presented to the winners of the 9/10 playoff games. Shields are to be engraved by that winning team/region and returned the following year at the opening ceremony. A small plaque is presented to each of the winning teams for the staff to keep or pass to their region. The referees for each of the medal games (Grand Finals and the Bronze medal games) are presented with a medallion. The Amarlie Carroll MVP Trophies are presented to the player adjudged the MVP at the 17-19s state championships. There is one for each gender. A 17-19s merit team of 10 players is selected in each gender and each player is presented with a medallion as recognition of this selection. A Players' Player award is presented to one player on each team, including the referees. This is supplied by the QRSS Basketball SEC and selected by each team under the guidance of the team coach and manager.



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Selection of referee/umpires to attend National Championships	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A minimum of 2 referees from each of the 10-12s and 13-16s state championships are selected to represent Qld at the SSA Nationals in each SSA age category. This selection is merit based and based on performance at the state championship. Selection is co-ordinated by the Referee Commissioner(s). The Basketball SEC will liaise with Basketball Qld to request financial support for these referees as a valid & valued referee pathway.
School Based Competitions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> School based competitions include state-wide competitions run by Basketball Qld Champion Basketball School of Qld (CBSQ) as well as regional competitions conducted by district and regional sporting committees, eg GPS Basketball, Primary School Gala Days.

Championship Rules and Guidelines

OVERALL INFORMATION

The competition rules for the 10-12s are different to the competition rules for the older age state championships. Both the 13-16s and the 17-19s state championships operate under the same competition rules.

The variation in competition rules between the 10-12s and the older age groups is due to a difference in ages, competition game timing and an historical difference in how these championships have been conducted, eg 10-12s use a full round-robin draw whereas both the 13-16s and the 17-17s use a draw with 2 pools per gender.

10-12 Years State Championship Competition Rules

QRSS 10-12yrs Basketball will follow FIBA rules and guidelines unless stated otherwise below.

- Scoring games should be completed electronically using Courtside or a similar program. If paper scoresheets are to be used, the convenor should make available copies for each coach as soon as possible after each completed game.
- Points will be awarded on — 3-win, 2-draw, 1-loss.
- Playing time
 - Four periods of 10 minutes each
 - Warm-up period of three minutes
 - Intervals of one minute between the first and second period and the third and fourth periods
 - Half time interval of three minutes between periods two and three.
 - No shot clock is used
- Playing numbers and under garments eg 'skins' must be as per FIBA guidelines.
- Period starting time:
 - The game timing device will be started at the designated start time of the match.
 - Where a previous match has caused a delay in the game start time then the timing device will be started three minutes after the completion of the previous match.
 - The subsequent periods' timing will start in accordance with the started playing times.
 - Warm up (three minutes) will commence as soon as the court has been declared vacant and at the referee's discretion.
- Period timing
 - Period one: the game clock does not stop for match infringements.
 - Period two: the game clock does not stop for match infringements.
 - Period three: the game clock does not stop for match infringements.
 - Period four: the game clock does not stop for match infringements for the first eight minutes. In the last two minutes the clock will stop for match infringements and time outs.
- Charge time-outs
 - One time-out per team will be available in periods one, two and three. In period four, two timeouts per team



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will be allowed. If a time out is called during the last two minutes from the back court, then the ball may be advanced to the front court.

- Charge time-outs will be of one minute duration. Play must restart immediately at the end of the one minute time-out.
- The game clock will stop for all time outs (including referee time outs).

8. Defence

- Man on man defence is obligatory (this is in the interests of junior development).
- Through consultation with both coaches, teams leading by 20 points may retire to the three-point line and resume defence once the ball has progressed halfway with no traps or presses. The relaxation of man on man defence is allowed in such a circumstance.

9. Three-point line and free throws

- Where under 12 and under 14 lines are marked for free throws, the state championships will use the under 14 line.
- Where under 12 and under 14 three-point lines are marked, the state championships will use the under 14 three-point line (outside line).

10. Tied results

Process for determining placings in a full round robin draw (ie all teams in one pool):

- In the event of a tie in a round robin draw, the results between the tied teams will initially form the basis for the decision.
- Then, the for and against results of the teams involved will be considered.
- Then, a count back of the results of the team finishing top, not including the teams involved in the tie.
- Then, a count back of the results of the team finishing second top, not including the teams involved in the tie.
- Then, the process in "d" will continue until a result is reached.
- In the event that teams are still tied the point "d" for and against should be considered against the team in the placing immediately above the tied teams.

Process for determining placings in pool rounds (if pools are used):

- In the event of a tie between two or more teams in a pool draw, the results between the tied teams will initially form the basis for the decision.
- Then, the for and against results of the teams involved will be considered.
- If two teams are still tied, then the results of the tied teams only will form the basis of the decision.
- Then, a count back of the results of the team finishing top of the pool, not including the teams involved in the tie.
- Then, a count back of the results of the team finishing second top of the pool, not including the teams involved in the tie.
- In the event that teams are still tied the point "d" for and against should be considered against the team in the placing immediately above the tied teams.

12. Overtime in Medal Games:

In the event of scores being level at the conclusion of 'regulation' time in a medal game (3 v 4 or 1 v 2):

- Two (2) minutes overtime will be played.
- Overtime will commence with a jump ball. Further possessions will be determined by the possession arrow.
- One (1) timeout per team will be allowed in each overtime period.
- The clock will stop for match infringements and timeouts during the overtime period.
- The process of overtime as outlined above will continue for subsequent overtime periods if required, until a clear result is reached.

13. Championship draw

- The draw for the competition will be completed by a member of the Sport Executive Committee at least one month prior to the championships and forwarded to the host region for inclusion with championship bulletins.
- The draw will follow a format as per the attached samples, with options for both a 3 court (less preferred) and 4 court venue (most preferred).



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13-17 Years State Championship Competition Rules

QRSS 13-19yrs Basketball will follow FIBA rules and guidelines unless stated otherwise below.

1. Scoring games should be completed electronically using Courtside or a similar program. If paper scoresheets are to be used, the convenor should make available copies for each coach as soon as possible after each completed game.
2. The following timing rules can be extended up to the FIBA limits on application to the QRSS 10-19 Years Basketball Committee:
 - Four 10 minute quarters
 - Five minutes warm up
 - Five minutes half time, two minutes quarter time
 - Five time-outs (two in first half; three in second as per FIBA rules)
 - A 24/14 second shot clock is to operate in all games if possible.
 - The 24/14 second shot clock must operate for cross-over and finals games. (Application to vary this rule is to be made to the QRSS 10-19 Years Basketball Sport Executive Committee only when facilities/human resources are unavailable to run the shot clocks. Priority will be given to the major semi-finals if necessary.)
 - Extra periods of three minutes duration to be played in all games with one minute between extra periods.
3. Point allocations:
 - Win 2 points
 - Loss 1 point
 - Forfeit 0 points
4. Starting time:
 - Games will be as per scheduled time or five minutes after the previous game, whichever is the later.
5. Team regulations:
 - The number of players and playing uniform numbers should be as per FIBA regulations.
6. Court duty
 - Teams may be responsible for score-bench duty as rostered.
7. Championship draw
 - The draw for the competition will be completed by a member of the Sport Executive Committee at least one month prior to the championships and forwarded to the host region for inclusion with championship bulletins.
 - The draw will follow a format as per the attached samples, with options for both a 3 court (less preferred) and 4 court venue (most preferred).

Queensland Representative School Sport

Selection process and criteria

Selection Panel

- Chair of selectors
- Selectors from Regional Teams
- Additional independent selector (If required)

The Chair of the selectors will be the:

- Queensland team Coach or Manager
- Regional Team selectors

Additional independent selector

- An additional independent selector may be appointed if necessary.
- The independent selector must not be attached to any team at the competition.
- The cost of this person is included into the budget and will be included in the team levy.
- The preference is that this person is from the state sporting organisation to ensure we continue to foster and build upon relationships.

Process

Prior to the Championship

1. Queensland Representative School Sport advertises for Team Official positions
2. Successful applicants must complete the mandatory training prior to the State Championship
3. QRSS will communicate the Chair of Selectors to each region
4. Region will send the final team lists to the Chair of Selectors
5. As part of bulletin 2, regions will request nominations for the panel of selectors
6. Chair of selectors will complete the selectors booklet for distribution at the pre-championship meeting.

At the Championship

1. Chair of selectors establishes a roster for each game
2. At least one member of the selection panel must be present for each game
3. Each panel member must attempt to see part of each of the games (draw permitting)
4. Regional team officials must be consulted daily regarding selection
5. Notes must be kept for each athlete wishing to be selected

Schedule

Pre-Championship meeting

- Meet and discuss the selection booklet
- Establish the criteria
- Discuss the roster for each game

Day 1

- Game observations
- Regional team official consultation
- Preliminary selection meeting with the panel post last game
- Presentation of preliminary list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and regional team officials

Day 2

- Game observations
- Regional team official consultation
- Selection meeting post last game
- Presentation of revised list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and regional team officials

Day 3

- Game observations
- Regional team official consultation
- Presentation of final list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and regional team officials

Day 4

Prior to the Grand Final, the final team selection is made



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Sport Specific Selection Processes

At Basketball Championships, all regional coaches are expected to have input into the selection of the state team. Such input involves:

- Completing player identification sheets, highlighting the potential of players in their team to represent at the next level, as well as players from other teams observed during competition at the state championships.
- Attending selection meetings open to all coaches, conducted on each day of the championship.

A panel of selectors will be tasked with the final responsibility for the selection of the state team. This panel will be chosen at the pre-championship meeting. This panel will be chaired by the state coach and comprise at least 4 other coaches, including the state team assistant coach. If the competition is in pools, there must be representation from both pools.

Efforts should be made to reach consensus during the selection process, but the final selection of the state team and shadow players will be the responsibility of the selection panel. In the end, where consensus is not reached, any final decision will be made by the state coach.

At the 17-19s state championship an honorary state team consisting of 10 players per gender is selected.

At the 13-16s state championship a state team consisting of 10 players per gender is selected. A further 10 players per gender are selected as shadow players.

At the 10-12s state championship a state team consisting of 10 players per gender is selected. A further 5 players per gender are selected as shadow players.

In extenuating circumstances, a vacancy in the state team may be filled from outside the shadow group, on the following conditions:

- There is no shadow player suitable to replace the player who has withdrawn from the team (eg specialist point guard)
- The player was in the list of 'possible' state team players discussed at selections
- The Chair of the Basketball Sport Executive and/or relevant QRSS Officer has been notified and has granted approval.
