## Sport Competition Guidelines

## Minimum Venue Standards

The host region venue must comply with audit requirements and:

- complete a procurement process (where required).
- have sufficient and suitable (e.g. cabin/motel style) accommodation within the host town/city to provide places for all visiting parents/supporters competitors/ student officials/team officials
- have access to appropriate transport to/from the host town/city
- have access/proximity to 24 hour medical services (e.g. hospital, ambulance, dentist, physio)
- The playing venue must be a suitable standard and must comply with the sport specific minimum requirements. Consideration must also be given to factors such as:
o sufficient number of suitably sized change rooms present
o spectators must be adequately catered for with suitable viewing, toilet facilities, canteen etc.
o Competition Area - Field of Play/number of courts or fields required
o Suitable shade \& shelter for hot \& wet weather if necessary
o Access to water
o Officials' Room with secure area for official's bags
o Championship working group control room
- Access to internet
- Laptop and printer
- Photocopier
- Paper
- General stationery


## First Aid

A minimum of two First Aid Officers/Sports Trainers must be provided each day of competition. Any child treated must be accompanied by a Team Official or parent.

## Spectator's facilities

Ensure there is sufficient shade, seating, toilets facilities, food and drinks vendors.

## Officials

It is preferable that all key officials have a minimum Level accreditation and first aid/CPR. The key officials are (but not limited to):

- Tournament Director
- Technical Convenor
- Chief Referee

Additional officials required (list individually)
Student Officials - insert QRSS 'categories'

## Equipment

- The Host Region must supply all equipment for the safe conduct of the Championships.
- All equipment must comply with sport specific requirements
- Other necessary equipment is:
o Competition Software (if applicable)
o Access Passes (if applicable)
o Match equipment (balls)

Competition areas must be checked each day for potential hazards and steps must be taken to rectify or make safe these potential hazards.

## Duration and Draws

Duration of championships are to be scheduled to use no more than two school days for competition. Where this cannot occur, the Host Region will communicate with the QRSS - RC and QRSS for approval and endorsement.

Such issues may include:

- availability of venues,
- number of games played per day etc

At each State Championship for team sports, the draw must ensure that all teams play on each day of the event.

At each State Championship a Queensland team may be selected and named (as a travelling or merit team). No other teams are to be named.

The sport specific competition procedures outline the draws and round robin matches to be played for various formats.

## Championship Rules and Guidelines

## 10-12 Years Girls \& Boys

## State Championship Competition Rules

- The championship shall be conducted as a two pool competition.
- The duration of matches shall be 20 minutes each half, with five a minute break at half time.
- All games are to be officially timed by the referee. No timeout for injury will be allowed unless there is an extended delay due to serious injury.
- Abandoned games - If conditions are applicable, where a stoppage extends a game past the scheduled completion time, the game will be completed on that field. The competition times for that day will be adjusted in order that the next round of games following will all begin simultaneously. If conditions cannot be met to extend the completion time of the game, the game will be abandoned and the score at the time of abandonment will stand as the result of that game.

Conditions of Play

- Conditions that may prevent the day's completion time being extended would include such conditions (but not restricted too) as;
0 The fields required by a club for their games or training
o Regional Teams required to be at an airport for check in
o Fading light, no provision for flood lights
o Personnel (eg sport medicine) having other appointments for that day
o Weather
- The treatment of injuries shall be left to the discretion of the referee. Any such treatment should be carried out by the manager, coach or appointed first aid/ medical official.
- Official score cards for each game are to be filled out by the referee and countersigned by team coaches or managers.
- Team officials and interchange players of both teams shall be seated in their respective 'coaches' boxes (technical area) on the same side of the field.
- An unlimited return substitution (interchange) system shall be utilised. The incoming player is to enter the field at the half way line after the replaced player has left the field. There will be no return substitutions in the last five minutes of the second half of normal playing time. The exception will be where a player is injured in that period and has to be replaced for treatment.
- Managers and coaches (or approved team officials) will be responsible for managing the return substitution (interchange) policy.
- Corner kicks shall be taken eight metres from the penalty area or from the actual corner post when this is less than eight metres from the penalty area. The mark for corner kicks shall be defined.
- Points will be awarded on the basis of four points for a win, two points for a draw and one point for a loss.
- The maximum goal difference in any match to be counted towards overall result is +5



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- In the event of a tie on points at the conclusion of the championship, joint winners will be declared. Medallions will be presented to members of the winning team, the runners-up and third place in the overall competition. The winning team of students, their coach and manager will receive gold medallions; the runner's up will receive silver medallions and the third place team bronze medallions.

Disciplinary Committee

- The disciplinary committee will be the:
o Convenor or nominee
o Executive member or nominee
o A team manager/coach nominated at the pre-championship meeting
- Please note: the executive member or nominated manager/coach will not adjudicate if the player is from their team of which they are a team official.
- For send-off offences the disciplinary committee will meet with the referee, the referee coordinator (or nominee) and the player's team manager or team coach.
- A player will be disqualified from participating in the next game their team is involved in if:
o he/she is sent off
o he/she has been given three yellow cards throughout the championship
o a player who is sent off after being shown two yellow cards in the one game does not receive a further suspension on receiving a yellow card in a subsequent game.
- A player who is shown a red card for an offence unrelated to any cautions already received in a game is subject to missing another game if they receive a third yellow card.
- A player who is sent off during a game will remain on the team bench for the remainder of the game under the supervision of the team officials.
- A team official (manager or coach or other) reported by the referee for misconduct during a game will:
o Receive a verbal warning from the disciplinary committee or ii) Half match suspension
- A team official (manager or coach or other) sent from the technical area for misconduct:
o will receive a one match suspension ii) will not be allowed to communicate with their team during the warm up, during the game, halftime and during the warm down.
13-15 Years Girls, 13-16 Years Boys, 16-19 Years Girls, 17-19 Years Boys
Competition is played in two pools (odd and even). The composition of the pools is decided by the placing's of the teams (in each division, namely boys and girls) from the previous championships.

The following points will be awarded for Preliminary Rounds:

- Win
3 points
- Draw
1 point
- Loss
0 points
- There are no shootouts or extra time in preliminary rounds.


## Duration of play

- All games will consist of two halves of 30 minutes with a 10 minute break for half time. No time shall be added on for the preliminary games except for serious injuries or other major disruptions.


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- At the completion of the pool games, a further cross over round will be played to determine the teams involved in the semi-finals as well as the placing's play-off games. The winners of these two semi finals play each other in the Final to decide positions 1 and 2 and the losers play off to decide positions 3 and 4.

In the event of teams being tied on points in the pool stages, the following criteria (in order) will apply:

- Ranking Criteria:
o Highest points from the pool stage
o Most wins
o Best goal difference
o Most goals scored
o Least goals conceded
o Head to head result from pool games.
o Fair play (number of cautions accrued to that point of competition)
o Shoot-out (5 kicks each followed by sudden death)
- To determine the highest ranked loser from the crossover games 1 v 3 and 2 v 2 the above criteria applies.
- In the event of a draw at full time in both $1 v 3$ and $2 v 2$ crossover games the result will be decided by the above criteria.
- All other crossover games, in the case of a draw at full time, result will be decided by the above criteria.
- Competition controller will inform the fourth official prior to the final whistle if criteria (h) has to be applied for that match.
- Both Semi and Grand Finals and $3^{r d}$ v4th Finals, the game will proceed immediately to a Penalty Shootout in line with FIFA Rules. Only the 11 players who concluded the game on the field will be able to take part in the Penalty Shootout.
- In the event of a draw at full time in the remaining crossover games to decide placings from $5^{\text {th }}$ to $10^{\text {th }}$, the above ranking criteria will be applied up to and including all competition matches completed.

Cautions/suspensions

- In the event of a R4, R5 or R7 violation the player will be dismissed from the current game however will be eligible to play in the next programmed game.

o R4-DOGSO by hand
o R5 - DOGSO by foul
o R7 - Second Caution
```

- Should a player commit any of the following violations they will be automatically dismissed from the current game and an additional game. Potential exclusion from any further games will be subject to the judicial process.
o R1 - Serious Foul Play
o R2 - Violet Code
o R3-Spitting
o R6 - Offensive, insulting or gestures
- The caution count will re-start in the final (knockout) phase.


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- A manager or other team official may clarify cautions and the respective offence after the game with the referee (up to 30 minutes after the game). A player/team can only appeal a send-off suspension that is for more than the mandatory one match.


## Coaching

- Coaches may coach from the bench or technical area but may not walk up and down the side line to coach. If a technical area is designated, they (or anyone from the bench) must not leave this area during the game. Only the players and officials of the team are permitted inside the technical area and dugout.


## Futsal 13-14 Year Girls and Boys, 15-16 Year Girls and Boys

The championships are to be conducted under the rules of the game as endorsed by FIFA except as follows.

The following points will be awarded for Preliminary Rounds:

Draw 1 point
Loss 0 points
```

- The maximum goal difference in any match to be counted towards overall result is +8
- There are no shootouts or extra time in preliminary rounds.


## Duration of play

- All games will consist of two halves of 20 minutes with a 5 minute break for half time. No time shall be added on for the preliminary games.
- Selection of final teams
- All regions should play each other in the round games. Teams finishing $1^{\text {st }}, 2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}, 4^{\text {th }}$ on points progress to the semi-finals. $1^{\text {st }} v 4^{\text {th }}, 2^{\text {nd }} v 3^{\text {rd }}$. The winning teams to play the grand final and losing teams to play off for $3^{\text {rd }}$ place.


## Criteria

- Highest points from the pool stage
- Most wins
- Best Goal Difference
- Most Goals scored
- Least goals conceded
- winner from the team pool game


## All Play off for 3rd and 4th, Semi Finals and the Final

- If both teams are tied at the end of fulltime, the game will be decided with a penalty shootout in line with FIFA rules.
- If play-off games for finishing positions $5^{\text {th }}$ to $\mathbf{1 0}^{\text {th }}$ end in a draw, the above criteria will be applied to decide final placings (no shoot-out until criteria (f) as above).


## Cautions/suspensions

- A player who accumulates two cautions in the pool games will automatically be suspended for the next rostered game one game. A player cannot appeal a caution.
- The caution count will re-start in the final (knockout) phase of the championship whereby an additional two cautions will apply before a further one game suspension will be enforced.

- A manager or other team official may clarify cautions and the respective offence after the game with the referee (up to 30 minutes after the game). A player/team can only appeal a send-off suspension that is for more than the mandatory one match.


## Coaching

- Coaches may coach from the bench or technical area but may not walk up and down the side line to coach. If a technical area is designated, they (or anyone from the bench) must not leave this area during the game.


## SEQ Championships - primary schools (MN, ME, MW, SunC, SthC, DD)

The championship is open to the champion school teams from each sport region in the area designated South East Queensland. These regions being:

- Metropolitan East
- Metropolitan North
- Metropolitan West
- South Coast
- Sunshine Coast
- Darling Downs


## Entry levels

## - All levels will play 9 v 9 modified football

- Open Boys- accepted as Year Six (or lower) students. Teams may be mixed gender.
- Open Girls - Year Six (or lower). Teams cannot include boys.
- Junior Boys - Students in Year Five (or lower). Teams may be mixed gender. Can include students by age who are twelve years, but for educational reasons have not progressed to Year Six.
- Junior Girls - Students in Year Five (or lower). Teams cannot include boys .Can include students by age who are twelve years, but for educational reasons have not progressed to Year Six.


## School Teams

- Teams are the regional football champions. In a number of cases they will have had play-offs against other district champions within their region. The process to determine the school team participating from each region will be determined by each of the RSSOs. Students participating in the SEQ finals day are not regional sport representatives and, for example, are not entitled to purchase of regional school sport official apparel.


## Team size

- 12 players maximum


## Game times

- 20 minutes each way
- 5 minute break.
- No added on time for injuries
- Unlimited interchange.


## Points

- 4 win
- 2 draw
- 1 loss


## Ties

- In the event of two or more leading teams having equal points at the end of the round robin, the method for determining the winning team will be as follows.


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o If two teams are tied at the end of the pool round, the result of the game between the teams in the round robin will determine the placing. eg If Team $A$ and Team $B$ have equal points at the end of the round robin but Team $A$ beat Team $B$ in their fixture the pool winner will be Team $A$.
0 In the event of the tied teams having a draw in their round robin fixture, goal difference will determine the winner. eg If Team A has a greater goal difference then Team $B$ it will be declared the pool winner.
o In the event of the equal goal difference then the team that has scored most goals will be declared the pool winner
o In the event of three or more teams having equal points at the end of the round robin the pool winner will be determined on goal difference (Part B and C).
o In the event that pool winners are unable to be determined by the above criteria, a best of 3 penalty shootout between the tied teams (followed by sudden death shootout if needed) will determine the pool winner.

Final - in the event of a draw at the end of full time.

- A five-minute break followed by $2 \times 10$ minute halves, no break, Golden Goal.
- If the game is still drawn then a penalty shootout.

## First round

In the event of two or more teams finishing in equal places, the method for determining the order will be as follows:

- If two teams are tied, the result of the game between the teams will determine the placing. e.g. If Team $A$ and Team B have equal placing, but Team $A$ beat Team B in their fixture the higher place will go to Team A.
- In the event of the tied teams having a draw in their fixture, goal difference from all games played, will determine the winner. Eg. If Team A has a greater goal difference then Team B it will be declared the higher placegetter.
- In the event of the equal goal difference then the team that has scored most goals will be declared the higher placegetter. In the event of three or more teams having equal placing, the higher place getters will be determined on goal difference.
- In the event that everything is equal, a die will be rolled or a coin tossed to determine the higher place getters.
- Goal difference in pool A and pool B rounds - Goals FOR The maximum goals allowed 'FOR' will be five FOR all teams. Eg. if team A scores six goals or more the first five will only be counted for goal difference.

## Second round

- After the completion of the pool matches, the top three teams from each pool go into Group 1 which will determine the final places from 1-6.
- The bottom three teams from each pool go into Group 2 which will determine the final places from 712.
- Points from round one which, will be carried over to round two, shall be the points earned from playing round one teams going into the same round two pool.
- Teams from pool A will only play teams from pool B.
- Final placing will be determined by the total (round 1 and round 2 ) points accumulated.
- Teams finishing on equal first will be declared joint champions.
- In the event of two or more teams finishing in equal places for second or third, the method for determining the final placing order will be using results at the end of the second round.
- The toss of the coin or a roll of the dice WILL NOT be used. If teams cannot be separated the tie will remain.

## Selection process and criteria

Selection Panel

- Chair of selectors
- Selectors from Regional Teams
- Additional independent selector (If required)

The chair of the selectors will be the:

- Queensland team coach or Manager

Additional independent selector

- An additional independent selector may be appointed if necessary.
- The independent selector must not be attached to any team at the competition.
- The cost of this person is included into the budget and will be included in the team levy.
- The preference is that this person is from the State Sporting organisation to ensure we continue to foster and build upon relationships


## Prior to the Championship

1. Queensland Representative School Sport advertises for Team Official positions
2. Successful applicants must complete the mandatory training prior to the State Championship
3. QRSS will communicate the Chair of Selectors to each region
4. Region will send the final team lists to the Chair of Selectors
5. As part of bulletin 1, Regions will request nominations for the panel of selectors
6. Chair of selectors establishes a roster for each game
7. Chair of selectors will complete the selectors booklet for distribution prior to the State Championships.
8. Chair of selectors will meet with the Selection Panel at least 1 week prior to the State Championships.

At the Championship

1. At least one member of the selection panel must be present for each game
2. Each panel member must attempt to see part of each of the games (draw permitting)
3. Regional team officials must be consulted daily regarding selection
4. Notes must be kept by each member of the Selection Panel and selection panel daily meeting minutes

- Meet and discuss the selection booklet
- Establish the criteria
- Discuss the roster for each game
