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## Sport Competition Guidelines

## Minimum Venue Standards

The host region venue must comply with audit requirements and:

- complete a procurement process (where required).
- have sufficient and suitable (e.g. cabin/motel style) accommodation within the host town/city to provide places for all visiting parents/supporters competitors/ student officials/team officials
- have access to appropriate transport to/from the host town/city
- have access/proximity to 24 hour medical services (e.g. hospital, ambulance, dentist, physio)
- The playing venue must be a suitable standard and must comply with the sport specific minimum requirements. Consideration must also be given to factors such as:
o sufficient number of suitably sized change rooms present
o spectators must be adequately catered for with suitable viewing, toilet facilities, canteen etc.
o Competition Area - Field of Play/number of courts or fields required
o Suitable shade \& shelter for hot \& wet weather if necessary
o Access to water
o Officials' Room with secure area for official's bags
o Championship working group control room
- Access to internet
- Laptop and printer
- Photocopier
- Paper
- General stationery


## First Aid

A minimum of two First Aid Officers/Sports Trainers must be provided each day of competition. Any child treated must be accompanied by a Team Official or parent.

## Spectator's facilities

Ensure there is sufficient shade, seating, toilets facilities, food and drinks vendors.

## Officials

It is preferable that all key officials have a minimum Level accreditation and first aid/CPR. The key officials are (but not limited to):

- Tournament Director
- Technical Convenor
- Chief Referee

Additional officials required (list individually)
Student Officials - insert QRSS 'categories'

## Equipment

- The Host Region must supply all equipment for the safe conduct of the Championships.
- All equipment must comply with sport specific requirements
- Other necessary equipment is:
- Competition Software (if applicable)
- Access Passes (if applicable)

Competition areas must be checked each day for potential hazards and steps must be taken to rectify or make safe these potential hazards.

A pre-championship meeting, chaired by the host RSSO / Asst. RSSO, in conjunction with the QRSS-SE member in attendance shall be convened for the purpose of discussing the conduct of the championships. The convenor may also be involved in the hosting of the meeting.

Regional team lists are to be confirmed at the pre-championship meeting. No changes are to occur after the list is confirmed.

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A post-championship meeting may be convened and from this meeting recommendations may be put forward for consideration by the QRSS-GOLF. If recommendations are endorsed by regional delegates, these must then be submitted to the QRSS-MC for approval.

All regional officials must attend all meetings and official functions as organised by the championship convenor and/or the QRSS-GOLF. This would include any Professional development opportunities as organised by the QRSS-GOLF.

## Duration and Draws

Duration of championships are to be scheduled to use no more than two school days for competition. Where this cannot occur, the Host Region will communicate with the QRSS - RC and QRSS for approval and endorsement.

Such issues may include:

- availability of venues,
- number of games played per day etc

At each State Championship for team sports, the draw must ensure that all teams play on each day of the event.

At each State Championship a Queensland team may be selected and named (as a travelling or merit team). No other teams are to be named.

The sport specific competition procedures outline the draws and round robin matches to be played for various formats.

## Championship Rules and Guidelines

## OVERALL INFORMATION

All games are to be played under the rules as laid down by "The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland" in conjunction with the following Conditions of Play.

Mobile phones and other electronic devices must be turned off on the course during competition. Breach of this in stroke play is disqualification. Any local rules concerning the above must have precedence.

## 10-12 Years

No caddies will be allowed (penalty: disqualification).

## 54 hole stroke event

Play - a separate competition for boys and girls is to be conducted using gross scores.
Draw - random draws for position are to be conducted by the host region for the first three rounds. A seeded draw is to be done for the final round.

Method of determining a winner

- The winners of each subdivision will be determined by the lowest aggregate scores from four rounds, ( 18 holes, 9 holes, 18 holes, 9 holes) stroke play, without benefit of handicap.
- In the event of a tie occurring after 54 holes of stroke play in either the boys or girls individual 54 hole stroke event all places, including the winners are to be decided by count backs.


## 54 hole handicap event

Play - an individual 54 hole stroke event, with the benefit of handicaps, shall be played in conjunction with the individual championships for boys and girls.

Method of determining a winner

- The winners of each division will be determined by the lowest aggregate scores from four rounds, ( 18 holes, 9 holes, 18 holes, 9 holes) stroke play, to be played with the benefit of handicap.
- In the event of a tie in the individual 54 hole handicap event, all places are to be decided by a count back.


## Teams Event

Play - a competition for girls and boys is to be conducted using gross scores from the four rounds of the 54 hole event.

Method of determining a winner

- The winning team will be the team with the least aggregate gross scores using the aggregate score of the best three rounds each day for the boys together with the best round each day for the girls to count.
- In the situation that scores are equal, then places are decided by a count back, using the aggregate team score after 45 holes, then the aggregate after 27 holes and if necessary the aggregate after 18


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holes. In the situation that scores are still equal then a tie will be declared and the trophy shared and presentations made to each team.

## 13-19 Years

A player must possess an Australian handicap. They must have a golf link number or be in the process of obtaining a golf link number. No caddies will be allowed (penalty: disqualification).

## 72 hole stroke event

Play - a separate competition for boys and girls is to be conducted using gross scores.
Draw - random draws for position are to be conducted by the host region for the first 36 holes. A seeded draw is to be done for the third \& forth round of 18 holes.

Method of Determining a winner

- The winners of each division will be determined by the lowest aggregate scores from four rounds, each of 18 holes stroke play, without benefit of handicap.
- In the event of a tie occurring by two or more competitors after 72 holes of stroke play in either the boys or girls individual 72 hole stroke event, a sudden-death play-off shall be conducted from a tee to be determined by the tournament committee to determine the winner.
- In the event of a tie occurring by two or more competitors, all minor placings in the boys or girls individual 72 hole stroke event are to be decided by a count back.


## 72 hole handicap event

Play - an individual 72 hole stroke event, with the benefit of handicaps, shall be played in conjunction with the individual championships for boys and girls.

Method of determining a winner

- The winners of each subdivision will be determined by the lowest aggregate scores from four rounds, each of 18 holes stroke play, to be played with the benefit of handicap.
In the event of a tie in the individual 72 hole handicap event, all places are to be decided by a count back


## Teams stroke play

Play - a separate competition for girls and boys is to be conducted using gross scores from the four rounds of the 72 hole stroke event.

Method of determining a winner

- The winning team will be the team with the least aggregate gross scores using the best six rounds each day for the boys and the best four rounds each day for the girls to count.
- In the situation that scores are equal, then places are decided by a count back, using the aggregate team score after 54 holes, then the aggregate after 36 holes and if necessary the aggregate after 18 holes. In the situation that scores are still equal then a tie will be declared and the trophy shared and presentations made to each team.


## Metropolitan Finals Team event Participation

- Each district may nominate one school team of five players, not from a School of Excellence in Golf, or a similar program.
- If a district does not conduct a competition, one school may represent the district with the approval of the district committee.
- Girls may be included to form a composite team but will tee off from the members markers.


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- A girls (only) team event may be held if there are enough girls teams nominated). A girls team shall consist of two players.


## Mode of play

- Quarter finals - nine hole aggregate stroke without the benefit of handicap (all scores to count).
- First four teams to qualify for the semi- finals. In the event of a tie the qualifying position shall be decided by the score of the fifth player.
- Semi Finals - 18 holes match play without the benefit of handicap. Draw is according to qualifying position, i.e. 1 v 4 and 2 v 3 . Captains shall exchange written team orders 5-1 i.e. first hit off to last hit off.
- Finals - 18 holes match play without the benefit of handicap. The winner of $1 \vee 4$ plays the winner of 2 v 3 . Losers are invited to play-off for 3rd and 4th positions if they so choose.

Throughout the competition a team shall comprise the same players except in extenuating circumstances.

## Champion of champions

- This event will be hold in conjunction with the metropolitan quarter finals.


## Participation

- Each school affiliated with a metropolitan district may nominate two representatives for both the boys' and the girls' event.•A school may nominate more than two competitors if boys - all have a QGU of handicap of 11 or less; girls - have a recognised WGQ handicap.
- There is no restriction to the number of girls necessary for their event to be conducted. $\ln$ event of a tie, if possible a sudden death playoff will be conducted on day one, two or three. If it is to be done on day two or three it is to be played before the teams event commences.


## Mode of play

- Boys 18 holes stroke play without the benefit of handicap. Girls at least nine and up to 18 hole stroke play without the benefit of handicap.


## Extra Information/offences

If a region has considerable depth, as advised by the executive, in a particular division they may increase their team size up to that equal to the same size of the state team in that division. These added players must be identified as such at the pre event meeting. Their scores will not be considered in determining the winning team.

## Adverse playing conditions

Play will continue under any weather conditions, except as follows.

- The club in question declares its course unplayable; or
- A suspension of play is declared by the referee appointed by the host region.

In the event of the above, the tournament convenor of the host region shall, without delay, convene a meeting of team managers, to determine what action will be taken to decide the winners of the event.

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## Selection process and criteria

## Selection Pane

- Chair of selectors
- Selectors from Regional Teams
- Additional independent selector (GA Consultant)

The chair of the selectors will be the:

- Queensland team coach or Manager
- Regional Team selectors

Additional independent selector

- An additional independent selector may be appointed if necessary
- The independent selector must not be attached to any team at the competition.
- The cost of this person is included into the budget and will be included in the team levy.
- The preference is that this person is from the State Sporting organisation to ensure we continue to foster and build upon relationships


## Process

## Prior to the Championship

1. Queensland School Sport advertises for Team Official positions
2. Successful applicants must complete the mandatory training prior to the State Championship
3. QRSS will communicate the Chair of Selectors to each region
4. Region will send the final team lists to the Chair of Selectors
5. As part of bulletin 2, Regions will request nominations for the panel of selectors
6. Chair of selectors will complete the selectors booklet for distribution at the Pre-Championship meeting

## At the Championship

1. Chair of selectors establishes a roster for each day
2. At least one member of the selection panel must be present for each round
3. Each panel member must attempt to see part of each of the rounds (draw permitting)
4. Regional team officials must be consulted daily regarding selection
5. Notes must be kept for each player wishing to be selected

Day 1

- Game observations
- Regional team official consultation
- Preliminary selection meeting with the panel post last round
- Presentation of preliminary list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from round observation and Regional team officials

Day 2
Round observations

- Regional team official consultation
- Selection meeting post last game
- Presentation of revised list of possible and probable players from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from round observation and Regional team officials

Day 3

- Round observations
- Regional team official consultation
- Presentation of final list of possible and probable players from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from round observation and Regional team officials

Day 4
Prior to the Final Round, the final team selection is made
