# Queensland Representative School Sport

## Sport Competition Guidelines

### Minimum Venue Standards

The host region venue must comply with audit requirements and:

- complete a procurement process (where required).
- have sufficient and suitable (e.g. cabin/motel style) accommodation within the host town/city to provide places for all visiting parents/supporters competitors/ student officials/team officials
- have access to appropriate transport to/from the host town/city
- have access/proximity to 24 hour medical services ( e.g. hospital, ambulance, dentist, physio)
- The playing venue must be a suitable standard and must comply with the sport specific minimum requirements. Consideration must also be given to factors such as:
  - sufficient number of suitably sized change rooms present
  - spectators must be adequately catered for with suitable viewing, toilet facilities, canteen etc.
  - Competition Area – Field of Play/number of courts or fields required
  - Suitable shade & shelter for hot & wet weather if necessary
  - Access to water
  - Officials' Room with secure area for official's bags
  - Championship working group control room
    - Access to internet
    - Laptop and printer
    - Photocopier
    - Paper
    - General stationery

### First Aid

A minimum of two First Aid Officers/Sports Trainers must be provided each day of competition. Any child treated must be accompanied by a Team Official or parent.

### Spectator's facilities

Ensure there is sufficient shade, seating, toilets facilities, food and drinks vendors.

### Officials

It is preferable that all key officials have a minimum Level accreditation and first aid/CPR. The key officials are (but not limited to):

- Tournament Director
- Technical Convenor

Additional officials required (list individually)

Student Officials – insert QRSS 'categories'

### Equipment

- The Host Region must supply all equipment for the safe conduct of the Championships.
- All equipment must comply with sport specific requirements
- Other necessary equipment is:
  - Competition Software (if applicable)
  - Access Passes (if applicable)

Competition areas must be checked each day for potential hazards and steps must be taken to rectify or make safe these potential hazards.

A pre-championship meeting, chaired by the host RSSO / Asst. RSSO, in conjunction with the QRSS-SE member in attendance shall be convened for the purpose of discussing the conduct of the championships. The convenor may also be involved in the hosting of the meeting.

Regional team lists are to be confirmed at the pre-championship meeting. No changes are to occur after the list is confirmed.



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A post-championship meeting may be convened and from this meeting recommendations may be put forward for consideration by the QRSS-SE. If recommendations are endorsed by regional delegates, these must then be submitted to the QRSS-MC for approval.

All regional officials must attend all meetings and official functions as organised by the championship convenor and/or the QRSS-SE. This would include any Professional development opportunities as organised by the QRSS-SE.

### Duration and Draws

Duration of championships are to be scheduled to use no more than two school days for competition. Where this cannot occur, the Host Region will communicate with the QRSS – RC and QRSS for approval and endorsement.

Such issues may include:

- availability of venues,
- number of games played per day etc

At each State Championship for team sports, the draw must ensure that all teams play on each day of the event.

At each State Championship a Queensland team may be selected and named (as a travelling or merit team). No other teams are to be named.

The sport specific competition procedures outline the draws and round robin matches to be played for various formats.

<p><b>Event Officials</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A maximum of one convenor per age group</li> <li>• A QRSS-Netball Executive per Championships</li> <li>• A Student Official Manager as appointed by the QRSS netball Executive</li> <li>• Two Umpire Educators as appointed by the QRSS netball Executive</li> <li>• Student Umpires (one umpire per number of participating teams plus 2)</li> <li>• Student bench officials (equivalent of one per participating team)</li> </ul>
<p><b>Additional teams (if required)</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Where a team cannot be fielded the QRSS Leadership handbook is to be used to implement additional teams.</li> <li>• Should a region require assistance to fill a team they will consult the host region for players.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Sporting Organisation Support (if required)</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As agreed by the QRSS-netball Executive and Netball Queensland, Netball Queensland personnel will provide coaching opportunities for all regional officials</li> <li>• Netball Queensland umpire contacts, as appointed by the QRSS executive, will work as umpire educators under the guidance of SOM for the duration of the Championship</li> <li>• Specifically, the QRSS-Netball Executive will appoint two (2) umpire coach/s for the main purpose of developing school-age umpires who attend the championships each year. The QRSS-netball Executive appointed umpire coach/s role is to work with these athletes prior to, and during the championships. At the championship, the QRSS-Netball Executive appointed umpire coach/s will work with all umpires and their development, providing feedback during and after each game that is umpired.</li> <li>• The umpire coach/s will work with the student official's manager (SOM) to ensure that student umpires are selected from as many regions as possible.</li> <li>• The umpire coach/s shall be provided with accommodation, flights, allowances in the event budget.</li> </ul>
<p><b>State Championship Team Officials</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Regional team will have 2 team officials each, the coach and manager, as appointed by their respective Regional Representative School Sport office.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Umpires</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All umpiring is undertaken by student officials as supervised by the SOM.</li> <li>• Umpires will be provided with written and verbal feedback for each game that they umpire.</li> <li>• Wellbeing and organisational needs are fulfilled by the SOM.</li> </ul>



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<b>Appointment of Queensland Team Officials</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As per QRSS Leadership Handbook.</li> <li>• 1 coach and 1 manager are appointed to each team that travels to a National Championships.</li> <li>• In the case that teams do not travel, personnel will be appointed as required.</li> </ul>
<b>Appointment of Selectors</b>	<p>The process:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• QRSS-Netball Secretariat advertises for Team Official positions to all Regional officials for that year</li> <li>• Applications will be sent to the Secretariat of QRSS–netball by COB on the due date.</li> <li>• QRSS-Netball Executive will meet to endorse selections.</li> <li>• In each age group and division, the State Coach is automatically one of the selectors.</li> <li>• Where there are more than the required number of applicants (2 in the 13-19 years' and 4 in the 10-12 years' age groups) the Secretariat will contact each Region's listed netball delegate for that year to vote. All votes will be returned to the Secretariat. Votes will come from each member of QRSS-Netball Executive as well as one from each region participating in that year in the age group and division.</li> <li>• The QRSS-Netball Executive member will announce the successful selectors and introduce them and the Queensland Coach at the pre-championship meeting.</li> <li>• Where there are insufficient applicants for the selection panel positions, the QRSS-Netball Executive member will call for nominations from the floor at the pre-championship meeting where any nominating regional official will provide an oral outline of their suitability for the position, after which regional delegates will vote should there be more nominees than the positions available. The successful candidate/s will be announced at the pre-championship meeting.</li> </ul>
<b>Announcement of the state team</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Queensland teams will be announced at the Closing Ceremony of the State Championships, along with the Queensland coach and manager.</li> <li>• Players and their parents/caregivers will meet with the Queensland coach and manager for approximately 30 minutes.</li> <li>• In the 10-12, 13-15 and 16-19 age groups and in both divisions of each, the State Coach will supply to the QRSS-Netball Executive member in attendance, the names of the selected team and any shadows on the form provided by the QRSS-Netball Executive Secretariat by no later than the start of the third quarter in the grand final (or in the case of no grand final, the final round of games for the Championships) for ratification.</li> <li>• In the 10-12 age group, a team of twelve (12) players will be selected and announced in the Queensland team, and a maximum of four (4) shadow players will also be announced.</li> <li>• In the 13-15 age group, a team of twelve (12) players will be selected and announced in the Queensland team, as will four (4) shadow players be announced.</li> <li>• In the 16-19 age group, a team of 10 players will be selected and announced in the Queensland team, as will three (3) shadow players be announced.</li> <li>• The selection panel must submit the final team to the QRSS-Netball Executive member in attendance for ratification prior to the end of the third quarter of the grand final (or final game where no finals take place).</li> </ul>
<b>Minimum Venue Standard</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For each age group and division, a minimum of 2 courts is required.</li> <li>• Indoor venues with adequate and safe warm up areas are preferred. At least one full-sized post for shooters to use in warm up is required.</li> </ul>



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A separate student official (umpire) room is to be made available for the duration of the Championship.</li> <li>• Where possible, a separate team official area/room is to be made available for all coaches and managers.</li> </ul>
<b>Eligibility</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To be eligible for the team, players must be a bona-fide school student and turn the ages listed in the calendar year of the competition. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Turn 10 or 11 to compete in the 10 – 11 years</li> <li>○ Turn 10 to 12 to compete in 10 - 12 years</li> <li>○ Turn 13, 14 or 15 years for 13 – 15 years</li> <li>○ Turn 16, 17, 18 or 19 years for 16 – 19 years</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Players can compete in only one age group each year</li> </ul>
<b>Participation expectations – sport specific</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Players/student officials are to adhere to the playing uniform requirements at all times.</li> <li>• Attendance for all games of the Championships is required by both players and student officials.</li> <li>• All players and student officials are required to commit to expected team requirements for safe and fair play and appropriate team conduct such as the warm up, warm down, code of conduct guidelines and safe play.</li> <li>• Attitude, respect &amp; sportsmanship are essential for all players and student officials at all times, both on and off the court.</li> </ul>
<b>Playing uniform</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Players are required to wear the approved regional/state playing uniform for all games.</li> <li>• At all other times (eg between games) players should wear the approved attire such as jackets, polo shirt and tracksuit.</li> <li>• Players taking the court must wear regional/state (&amp; approved) positional patches at all times (the exception being short blood/injury times as directed by the umpires).</li> <li>• Student umpires are required to wear the approved student official shirt, and predominantly white uniforms at all times when umpiring</li> <li>• Student official should also wear predominantly white apparel off the court, too, such as tracksuit top and bottoms.</li> </ul>
<b>Match equipment</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For each age group and division, there will be one netball required per court plus two. These will be rotated throughout the competition duration.</li> <li>• The umpires are responsible for returning match balls to the Championship convenor at the completion of each match.</li> <li>• At the completion of the Championship the match balls are given to the Queensland coach/es to be used for training the Queensland team/s.</li> <li>• Post padding is required for each post, and must be full post length.</li> </ul>
<b>Team Size</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ten (10) players per region per age group is the maximum team size.</li> <li>• The minimum team size is at the direction of the regions, but it is suggested that a team of nine (9) would be the desirable minimum size.</li> </ul>
<b>First Aid</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No injury time is allowed for any of the competition games except in the event of a serious injury where the player cannot be moved. In this situation the medical personnel in consultation with the Championship convenor and QRSS-Netball Executive will determine the appropriate action.</li> <li>• Blood Rule - The QRSS - Netball Blood Rule will apply. In the event of a stoppage in play due to blood and other injury, the affected player/s is/are immediately removed from the court. A substitute player/s may take the court in the vacated playing position/s. A positional patch change is not necessary. The removed player/s will return to the court, under instruction from an umpire at a convenient stoppage in play.</li> </ul>





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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At all other times All Australia Netball Rules apply with regard to blood and player injuries.</li> <li>• Concussion rules apply as per QRSS policy.</li> <li>• Emergency procedures. Should there be any specific venue or championship emergency procedures, they will be outlined at the Pre-Championship meeting by the QRSS-Netball Executive or Host Region/Convener</li> <li>• A first aid officer, as appointed by the Host Region, will be in attendance for the entirety of each Championships for the purpose of first aid required at the Championships. Players are expected to manage pre-existing injuries or illnesses.</li> </ul>
<b>Spectator's facilities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Seating for spectators to view each game is required, as are canteen facilities, and bathroom facilities.</li> <li>• Where there is limited seating to view games, the host region is to advertise the process to ensure that families of those playing are able to view their student's game (eg asking spectators to vacate the viewing area after each game).</li> <li>• Host regions are to ensure that spectators are not moving or accessing areas of the venue that cause disruption to the teams or officials playing on court.</li> </ul>
<b>Trophies and presentations</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• At the conclusion of the Championships each age group/division will present medallions/trophies for the first, second and third placed teams.</li> <li>• The number of trophies/medallions will be 12 per team (one for each player, and one for the manager and the coach).</li> <li>• Trophies/medallions will be awarded in order of 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> then 1<sup>st</sup>.</li> <li>• Each competing team from each region will receive a Most Valuable Player award. This is voted by opposition officials (coach or manager) at the end of each game. They award the points on the basis of the player who has made the most significant contribution to the team performance in that game. These points shall be noted on the score sheet after every game and shall be kept secret from players.</li> <li>• The trophy/medallion for the Most Valuable Player, one per region per age group and division, is to be organised by the QRSS-Netball Executive.</li> <li>• At the conclusion of the Championships, a Most Improved Umpire and a Best Umpire trophy/medallion will be awarded. Selection is decided by a panel including the QRSS-Netball Executive, Student Official Manager and the two (2) appointed Umpire Educators.</li> </ul>
<b>Selection of referee/umpires to attend National Championships</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Throughout the Championships, a panel led by the Student Official Manager, and in consultation with the two appointed Umpire Educators and the QRSS-Netball Executive member will select two student umpires, and two reserve student umpires to attend the Nationals for the 10-12 years and then separately the 13-15 years team/s Nationals. The number of student umpires may change especially if Queensland is hosting the Nationals, so the number of umpires will be confirmed by the QRSS-Netball Executive each year.</li> <li>• The student umpires selected to represent Queensland at Nationals will be announced at the Closing Ceremony.</li> </ul>
<b>School Based Competitions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• While QRSS-netball does not conduct any official school-based competitions for netball, there are a multitude of school-based competitions, either run by schools, districts, regions, or by Netball Queensland. Some of these include the Laura Geitz Cup, Queensland Country Cup, Vicki Wilson Cup, Primary Schools Cup, Vicki Wilson Shield, Super 7s and many more which schools may participate.</li> </ul>



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## Championship Rules and Guidelines

- The first mentioned team shall use the bench on the left when facing the court from the bench side.
- No injury time is allowed for any of the competition games. (see *First Aid section above*)
- All games should be four quarters by eight minutes.
- Breaks between the games shall be two minutes at quarter time, three minutes at half time and two minutes at three-quarter time.
- There shall be six minutes between games.
- The competition format shall be a full round robin, where all participating regions play against all other regions.

### Competition points are:

- 10 – 12 years – three for win, two for draw and 1 for a loss
- 13 – 19 years – two for a win, one for a draw and zero for a loss.

### Final Placings

#### 10 – 12 Years

- There will be no playoffs for the 10-11 or 10-12 age groups in either division.
- In the event of teams gaining the identical number of points at the conclusion of the rounds, the respective placing shall be determined by the result of the match between the two teams concerned, during the preliminary rounds.
- In the 10-12 age group, if two or more teams are tied on points for first, for and against results will be calculated from the games played against the teams that finished third to fifth.

#### 13 – 19 years

- All teams in the 13-19 age groups and divisions shall play off for final placings on the last day of the competition. These play-off placings are determined after each team has played against every other team at the championship in that age group and division. There will be no playoffs for 10 -11 years or 10-12 years.
- For the finals matches teams shall be placed in descending order according to the number of points gained.
- In the event of teams gaining the identical number of points, the respective placing shall be determined by the result of the match between the two teams concerned during the preliminary rounds.
- In the event of more than two teams gaining the identical number of points, the respective placings will be determined by the goal percentage of the matches between the tied teams.
- In the event of there being a tie for any placing at the completion of the preliminary rounds that cannot be resolved by applying (b) or (c) above, the following procedures (according to the number of participating teams) shall apply:
  - Placing 1/2 Percentage of top four teams calculated collectively
  - Placing 2/3 Percentage of top four teams calculated collectively
  - Placing 3/4 Percentage of teams placed 3rd through to 7th calculated collectively
  - Placing 4/5 Percentage of teams placed 4th through to 8th calculated collectively
  - Placing 5/6 Percentage of teams placed 5th through to 9th calculated collectively
  - Placing 6/7 Percentage of teams placed 6th through to 10th calculated collectively
  - Placing 7/8 Percentage of teams placed 7th through to 11th calculated collectively
  - Placing 8/9 Percentage of teams placed 8th through to 12th calculated collectively
  - Placing 9/10 Percentage of team placed 8th through to 12th calculated collectively



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- Placing 10/11 Percentage of teams placed 8th through to 12th calculated collectively
- Placing 11/12 Percentage of teams placed 8th through to 12th calculated collectively

- The QRSS-Netball Executive in consultation with the relevant teams and host region reserves the right to adjust the final day schedule to try to minimise regions playing at the same time in both their age groups.
- Presentations will commence within 15 minutes of the final whistle for the final round.
- In the play off for either third and fourth places, or first and second places, where a serious injury occurs, time out will be called at the discretion of the convenor and QRSS-Netball Executive in consultation with medical personnel.
- If, at the end of a play off for the top four positions, the teams are tied, the teams will have a one minute break before they play five minutes each way with an immediate change over after five minutes. If, at the end of extra time they are still even, the game will continue until one team is two points ahead.



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## Draft Draw

The following draw format is for each age group and each division, with **considerations**:

- Championships will generally be at venues where there are 2 courts per age group & division
- Four teams from each age group and division will play in each time slot
- No back-to-back games
- No more than 2 rounds between games for any one team
- At no time are teams in different age groups/divisions from the same region playing at the same time
- The two teams from a region (either different age or gender) will play other teams in the same order)
- The draw may need some modifications applied by the QRSS-Netball Executive until each age group & division has teams from all regions but in that case the same conditions will apply

### Selection process and criteria

#### Selection Panel

- Comprises the chair of selectors who is the Queensland team coach
- Two (2) other selectors as nominated prior to the Championships who shall be from the same age group and division as the Queensland team that is being selected, and as voted by the regional delegates and announced by the QRSS-Netball Executive at the Pre-Championships meeting
- Note – the Queensland manager is NOT a selector unless the position is won through the same nomination and ballot process as described above
- At each day's end-of-day meetings, there will be a QRSS-Netball Executive member in attendance to advise regarding QRSS-netball processes in selections of Queensland teams

#### Role of Regional Coaches:

- Each Region's Coach for that age group and division plays a key role in advocating for players from their own and other teams, with explanations, both throughout each day's play as well as at the end-of-day meetings

#### Selection Criteria for Queensland teams:

- Performance of the player at the State Championship, NOT past reputation
- Skill level exhibited by the athlete
- Fitness level of the athlete
- Performance of the player as a member of the team
- Attitude and behaviour of the player on and off the court, coachability, communication, team work and problem solving ability

### Process

#### Prior to the Championship

- Appointment of selectors as per above. The successful candidates and / or process if there are insufficient nominations as per above will be announced by the QRSS-Netball Executive at the pre-championship meeting.
- The QRSS-Netball Executive member will conduct a meeting with the selection panel prior to the start of play at each year's Championships to discuss the selection process, accountability and to establish clarity around the selection criteria

#### At the Championship

- Chair of selectors establishes a roster for each game for the selection panel
- At least one member of the selection panel must be present for each game
- Each panel member must attempt to see part of each of the games (draw permitting)
- Regional team officials must be consulted daily regarding selection both during the day as well as at the day's official meeting
- Notes must be kept for each athlete wishing to be selected
- At all times, discussion regarding selection must include reasoning for comments, from regional coaches or the selection panel
- Day 1 preliminary selection meeting with the panel post last game of the day (1 official per region, 1 QRSS-Netball Executive member and the selection panel must attend, with venue and time TBA by QRSS-Netball Executive)
- Aim of Day 1 meeting is to put forward names of players from own regional team
- All present at meeting will be aware of, and agreeable to, the full list of players put forward after Day 1

1. Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and Regional team officials takes place at the daily meetings
2. All discussions to remain confidential, privy to those in attendance only
3. Day 2 selection meeting run as per Day 1, but following days 2 & 3, regional coaches may put forward players from other teams, and may speak on behalf of any players from their own team who they feel have not been highlighted
4. At any time, team coaches may put forward in writing, any comments regarding selections

### Availability of Players for Queensland Selection

- At the pre-carnival meeting Regional officials will be consulted so that any players who are not available for Queensland selection is made public for the selection panel and all other regional officials.

### Possible vs Probable Trials (13-15 years and 16-19 years)

- Possible and probable trials will be held at the conclusion of the third day of the State Championships for the 13-15 and 16-19 years age groups and divisions
- Trials will take place for between 45-60 minutes
- All players who wish to be considered for selection in these trials must be in attendance at the possible vs probable trials
- All regional officials must make themselves aware of the standards necessary for selection of a player in the Queensland team and should attend the possible vs probable trials

### Disputes

- A disputes committee will be elected at the pre-carnival meeting, and must contain a minimum of three officials from three different regions.
- Any protests must be lodged with the disputes committee in writing within 15 minutes of the termination of the respective game. The decision of the Disputes Committee is final.

### Acknowledgement of Service

At the Opening or Closing Ceremony, the significant service of individual officials will be recognised as determined by the QRSS-Netball Executive. This may include Life Membership, and 5 year incremental periods of service such as 5 years, 10 years, 15 years etc.
