NOTE: This manual is to be read in conjunction with the:

- School Sport Australia policies and guidelines
- Queensland Representative School Sport Leadership handbook





The host region venue must comply with audit requirements and:

- complete a procurement process (where required).
- have sufficient and suitable (e.g. cabin/motel style) accommodation within the host town/city to provide places for all visiting parents/supporters competitors/ student officials/team officials
- have access to appropriate transport to/from the host town/city
- have access/proximity to 24 hour medical services (e.g. hospital, ambulance, dentist, physio)
- The playing venue must be a suitable standard and must comply with the sport specific minimum requirements. Consideration must also be given to factors such as:
 - o sufficient number of suitably sized change rooms present
 - spectators must be adequately catered for with suitable viewing, toilet facilities, canteen etc.
 - o Competition Area Number of Diamonds and Warm-Up Areas
 - Suitable shade & shelter for hot & wet weather if necessary
 - Access to water
 - o Officials' Room with secure area for official's bags
 - o Championship working group control room
 - Access to internet
 - Laptop and printer
 - Photocopier
 - Paper
 - General stationery

First Aid

A minimum of two First Aid Officers/Sports Trainers must be provided each day of competition. Any child treated must be accompanied by a Team Official or parent.

Spectator's facilities

Ensure there is sufficient shade, seating, toilets facilities, food and drinks vendors.

Officials

It is preferable that all key officials have a minimum Level accreditation and first aid/CPR. The key officials are (but not limited to):

- Tournament Convenor
- Technical Chief Umpire
- Umpire Educator
- SOM
- Student Officials (umpires, statisticians, coaches)
- Tournament Chief Statistician

Equipment

- The Host Region must supply all equipment for the safe conduct of the Championships other than personal playing equipment e.g., gloves, bats, helmets, catchers gear, hats, etc.
- All equipment must comply with sport specific requirements
- Competition Software (if applicable)
- Access Passes (if applicable)

Competition areas must be checked each day for potential hazards and steps must be taken to rectify or make safe these potential hazards.

Duration and Draws

Duration of championships are to be scheduled to use no more than two school days for competition. Where this cannot occur, the Host Region will communicate with the QRSS – RC and QRSS for approval and endorsement.

Such issues may include:

availability of venues and number of games played per day etc

At each State Championship for team sports, the draw must ensure that all teams play on each day of the event.

At each State Championship a Queensland team may be selected and named (as a travelling or merit team). No other teams are to be named.

The sport specific competition procedures outline the draws and round robin matches to be played for various formats.

- Arrange catering facilities.
- o Ensure that adequate shade is provided.
- Ensure that the playing benches are adequately shaded and water containers and ice are available on all playing benches.
- Arrange accommodation for team and QRSS Softball 10-19yrs Sport Executive officials, Technical Chief Umpire plus Umpire Educators (if appointed), selectors, and SOM.
- Arrange transfer of duty requirements for any sport Executive officials attending the championships.
- If necessary, organise transport for teams and officials.
- In consultation with Sport Executive arrange Professional Learning & Officials Recognition Session
- Service sponsors according to QRSS 10-19 years School Sport Policy Guidelines.
- Seek local sponsorship.
- Organise venues for all meetings to be convened during the championships.
- Make arrangements for first aid/sports medicine facilities with ice provided each day for managers. Provide managers with accident report forms. Inform team officials of nearby medical, dental and other related centres.
- Arrange for the diamonds to be marked accordingly.
- Provide all team and executive officials with a championship information folder which would include: meeting agendas, previous meeting minutes, draw, program, score cards, Professional Learning & Officials Recognition Session/ Dinner Information, lunch order forms, accident report forms, bus roster (if arranged), medical facilities list, and social events etc.
- Risk Management Assessments are completed daily and records are kept.
- Arrange media cover.
- Ensure all safety procedures as set out in the Education Queensland Manual: Health & Safety HS-10: Workplace, Health and Safety - Curriculum (Policy & Guidelines) shall be adhered to throughout the championships.
- Arrange for the printing of the program. Check with Queensland Representative School Sport to ascertain which sponsors' advertisements must be included.
- Organise medallions, MVP Awards. Numbers of medallions are to include the coach, assistant coach and manager.
- Remind previous years winning teams to bring back trophy/s.
- Make arrangements for team photographs to be taken through the host region.
- Make arrangements for the sale of QRSS Merchandise.
- Include Codes of Behaviour for Players, Parents and Spectators in the championship program (Refer to Queensland Representative School Sport's Competition Procedures).
- Immediately notify QRSS for resolution of any dispute that cannot be settled.
- Within eight weeks of the conclusion of the state carnival, provide a written report to QRSS and QRSS Softball 10-19yrs Sport Executive, to include all results, recommendations and financial statement. This report should include any media articles and/or photographs that the organising committee was successful in obtaining.

10-12 Years Boys and Girls competition rules

Overall Information

The championships are to be conducted under Softball Australia rules and Interpretations as endorsed by the QRSS 10-19 years Softball Executive except wherein stated.

State Championship Rules:

- Games shall be of 1 hour 15 minutes duration or a regulation game of seven innings, whichever is
 arrived at first. Should the score in a game be tied at the end of the seventh innings, a tiebreaker will
 be played until a winner is determined or time is called for a "time game".
- If a game ends on an incomplete innings, the winning team shall be the team scoring the most runs at the end of the last completed innings, unless the team actually batting in the bottom half of the incomplete innings has scored the most runs, then that side shall be the winner OR if the number of runs scored by both sides is the same, the game shall be drawn. Exceptions are:
 - Semi-finals one hour fifteen minutes duration or a regulation game of seven innings. If the score is tied after completion of the seven innings and time remains, the tiebreaker rule shall apply. That is, starting from the top of the eight innings, and each half innings thereafter the offensive team will begin its turn to bat with the player who is scheduled to bat ninth in that respective half innings being placed on second base. If after time has lapsed and even innings played and score is tied game is played until there is a winner with even innings played. Or other option could be is to go to tie breaker rule so as to get a winner.
 - Grand final as for semi-finals. Should any grand final either using the above tiebreaker or not, result in a drawn or abandoned game both teams will be declared winners.
- Games will start and finish by the plate umpire's watch. No new innings will be commenced in the last five minutes of a game if teams have had even offensive innings.
- The official diamond shall have a pitching distance of:
 - o Boys 12.19m (40ft)
 - o Girls 11.58m (38ft)
- Points shall be awarded as follows:
 - Win 3 points
 - o Draw 2 points
 - o Loss 1 point
 - o Forfeit 0 points

If two or more teams have gained an equal number of points, placings shall be decided in the following order by:

- Percentages (Runs scored against/defensive innings played)
- o The result of the game played between the two teams
- Protests are to be lodged in writing within 10 minutes of the completion of the game. The convenor will receive all protests and forward them to the protest committee. The decision of this committee is final. Protests will only be received on issues involving a misinterpretation of a rule, the failure of an umpire to apply the correct rule or a failure to impose a correct penalty for the violation of a rule. The umpire must be notified at the time before the next pitch, of the intention to protest.
 - Semi-finals and finals protests will be heard immediately upon notification that a protest has been lodged.
- In order to speed up play, a runner may enter the game to replace the catcher on base when there are two outs. That runner can be anyone in the playing line up that is not in the next four batters. Using a runner for the catcher does not constitute as a substitution.
- A "designated runner", referred to as a "DR", may be used for any base runner once only in any
 offensive innings, provided it is made known prior to the start of the game and the player's name is
 indicated on the line-up sheet.
 - o The "DR" may be used as a substitute for any fielder or batter during the game; and/or.





- The "DR" may be substituted for at any time by a player who then becomes the "DR". The substitute must be a player who has not been in the game.
- If at the time of the "DR" entering the game as a substitute a replacement "DR" is not named, the position of "DR" shall lapse.
- The designated enclosed fence distances will be within the range of 60.96m (200ft). The exceptions to this will be in the advent of a pre-existing fence. In this case the fence will remain and the enclosed fence distance will be as exists. Should a fence not be erected for the championships, and where it is possible for all diamonds to have the same unobstructed playing surface an open diamond will be played. A batted long fly ball going beyond the marked distance will be awarded an automatic home run. A batted ground ball which bounces or rolls through the boundary is played out as per an open diamond. Any blocked ball by an obstruction two bases will be awarded.
- Rule 6 Sect. 8 Intentional Walk as detailed in the Softball Australia Rulebook will not apply in this competition.
- No metal cleats, steel studs or screws are permitted.
- A pitcher in any one game is restricted to a maximum of four innings, with only three innings consecutive.
- Due to an injury and if all reserves have been used, you are allowed to reuse or re-enter a player so as not to forfeit the game and to allow all players to be used in every game.
- In round robin competition, an innings is completed when either three outs have been made or 5 runs have crossed the plate.
 - Note: This rule does not apply for the final series (Semi-Finals, Preliminary Finals, Grand Finals or any other games determined to be part of the final series)
 - Note: On an automatic home run, all runs will be scored and counted in the total runs for that inning.
- The first named team in all matches will occupy the first base bench and call the toss.
- A conference is allowed one per offensive and defensive innings.
- Completed scorecards, showing the result of the game for each innings played, and signed by the plate umpire, shall be handed to the championship registrar immediately after the game. These results are to be displayed for all to peruse.
- Any player who in the opinion of the plate umpire throws a bat dangerously, whether or not that bat hits a person shall be declared out. The ball is dead and base runners must return to the base held at the time of the pitch.
 - Warm up on diamonds is allowed prior to the commencement of games:
- Twelve minutes before the game the team to bat first has the diamond.
 - Seven minutes before the game the team to field first has the diamond and then stays there for the game to begin.
- A minimum of 15 minutes is allowed between games.
- Individual players will be responsible for providing their own playing and safety equipment. Catchers will be responsible for providing all protective equipment necessary as stated in the current rules of softball.

Structures:

The championships shall be conducted – girls over four days and boys over four days

Parental consent, personal details and medical forms, and principal's approval form:

- Team officials must ensure that these forms are completed and brought to the championships by the
- Team officials must provide a completed personal details form and medical form.

Match balls:





- The host region organising committee will be responsible for the supply of all match balls if there is no sponsorship available or in-kind agreement. All games will be played with an 11" leather softball. Minimum of three dozen balls.
- After the carnival these balls are to be provided to the current state team officials to be used for state training.

Team levy:

A team levy will be set to help offset the cost of conducting the championships. This levy will be determined each year by the QRSS Softball 10-19yrs Sport Executive in consultation with the host region and follow the levy and budget guidelines from Queensland Representative School Sport.

Team officials:

- All team official names and their position/s in the team must be listed on the official team list and ratified by the respective regional sports officer prior to the commencement of the championships. All regional team officials will be presented to the pre championship meeting by the convenor for the meeting's endorsement. Only officials listed on this team list are permitted to sit on the bench and to take part in the game.
- Scorers must be nominated to the plate umpire prior to the game commencement.

Championship draw:

- All regions are invited to compete in the championships but if an uneven number of teams indicate their participation, another team from the host region may be invited to participate.
- The championship draw will be finalised by the QRSS Softball 10-19yrs Sport Executive and forwarded to the RSSO and championship convenor for dissemination via bulletin to the participating teams...
- The format for the championships will be a full round robin. The girls draw will use a four-diamond draw and the boys draw may use three diamonds (see Appendix 1 and Appendix 2). This may change due to the number of team nominated. Changes will be updated by the QRSS Softball 10-19yrs Sport Executive.
- At the completion of the boy's round robin semi-finals will be played: 1 v 4 and 2 v 3. A grand final will then be played between the winning teams of each semi-final.
- At the completion of the girl's round robin a grand final will be played between the two highest ranked teams.
- If the round robin is incomplete, the winner will be determined by the results at the completion of the amended competition, with reference to the following:
 - A minimum of six completed rounds by all regions must have been completed. In order to achieve this, the following will apply:
 - abandoned rounds will be postponed initially and may be rescheduled if time allows (additional time slots may be considered, if possible, at the venue)
 - should it be necessary to use the semi-final and grand final time slots to achieve the minimum number of completed rounds, this will receive priority
- If, due to the loss of a significant portion of the competition on days one and two to inclement weather, it is evident that sufficient rounds may not be completed to achieve an outcome as stipulated above; the championship (as determined from previous year's placings) will be played for the remaining rounds of the championship, to enable a state team to be selected.
- Due to any unforeseen circumstances such as wet weather and a round is incomplete. The draw maybe altered under the direction of the host region, TCU and sports specific executive or key person. Where possible, night games could be played. Medallions may be presented to state team members.





Interruption of games:

- For all interrupted games, the recommencement of play will be from the point of the interruption unless determined otherwise by the Disputes committee.
- If a regulation game of three innings or a minimum of one hour has been completed, the game will not be recommenced unless time within the normal allocated timeframe permits.
- In the event of a protest, the umpire will note the time taken for the protest to be heard and decided. This time will be added to the finishing time for the game to ensure full time allocation for the game.
- In the event of an injury to a player extending beyond five minutes, the umpire will note the time taken for the treatment of the injury. This time will be added to the finishing time for the game to ensure the full-time allocation for the game.
- If the injury time extends beyond fifteen minutes, the tournament chief umpire may declare the game to be an "interrupted game".

13-19 Years Boys and Girls competition rules

Overall Information

The 13-19 years age division provides multiple opportunities for students to participate in, develop and grow their softball skills by supporting District and Inter-regional Competitions and offering the QRSS-SE Golden Glove Softball Challenge (13-19yrs) at differing times throughout the year. These opportunities are offered with the aim of providing inclusive, social and lifelong experiences which in turn help to support students' health and wellbeing in the hope they continue this pursuit into adulthood.

The pinnacle of the softball representative program, is the QRSS State Championships. Here, Regions are invited to compete for the Title of State Champions and provides students the opportunity through equity and excellence for selection into a State team (a boys and girls State Teams are selected), to compete at the School Sport Australia National Championships. Students then represent their state vying for the podium title of National Champions and furthermore, selection into an All Australian Team.

Below are the Specific Rules for the QRSS 13-19yrs State Championships and the QRSS-SE Golden Glove Softball Challenge for organisation and rule clarity. District and Inter-regional Competitions are usually conducted under modified rules to increase participation.

All competitions are to be conducted under Softball Australia Limited (SAL) Rules and Interpretations as endorsed by the QRSS Softball 10-19yrs Sport Executive except wherein stated. Competition Rules will be listed in order:

- QRSS 13-19yrs State Championships Competition procedures
- QRSS-SE Golden Glove Softball Challenge

Structure:

- The Championships shall be conducted:
 - o Girls over three and a half days
 - Boys over three and a half days

Paperwork:

 Team managers must ensure that they have accessible access to all students forms at the State Championships. This includes all mandatory QRSS student paperwork

Umpires:

Regions are invited to bring student officials to participate. i.e. student official umpires. This student
would be considered as part of the team and in so doing, would become an extra team member but





not be included in the playing squad. As a team member that student will abide by the rules and conditions applying to all team members.

It is the policy of Queensland Representative School Sport to encourage suitable qualified student umpires to participate at this level as this provides another avenue for sport education.

Team Officials:

- Each regional team must have minimum of 2 officials to a maximum of 3, consisting of either: coach, assistant coach or manager.
- All officials entering the field of play must meet mandatory requirements as per the Team Officials Matrix (outline for appointment of team official positions) published in the QRSS Leadership Handbook, and named in the program.
- All team officials' names and their position/s in the team must be listed on the official team list and ratified by the respective Regional Sports Officer prior to the commencement of the Championships. All regional team officials will be presented to the pre championship meeting by the Convenor for the meeting's endorsement. Only officials listed on this team list are permitted to sit on the bench and to take part in the game.
- Scorers/ statisticians must be nominated to the plate umpire prior to the game commencement. Scorers/ statisticians is not a team official must comply with Child Safety requirements (hold a Blue Card).

Rules:

- Games shall be of 1 hour 15 minutes duration or a regulation game of seven innings, whichever is arrived at first. Should the score in a game be tied at the end of the seventh innings, a tiebreaker will be played until a winner is determined or time is called for a "time game".
- If a game ends on an incomplete innings, the winning team shall be the team scoring the most runs at the end of the last completed innings, unless the team actually batting in the bottom half of the incomplete innings has scored the most runs, then that side shall be the winner OR if the number of runs scored by both sides is the same, the game shall be drawn. Exceptions are:
 - Semi-finals 1 hour 30 minutes duration or a regulation game of seven innings. An innings once started must be completed. An innings may not be started within five minutes of the end of the game.
 - Grand Final as for semi-finals. In semi-finals or the grand final, if games are drawn at completion time or seven innings additional tie breaker innings will be played until a result is determined.
- Games will start and finish by the plate umpire's watch. No new innings will be commenced in the last five minutes of a game if teams have had even offensive innings.
- The official diamond shall have a pitching distance of:
 - Boys 14.02m (46ft)
 - Girls the official diamond shall have a Girls pitching distance of 13.11m (43ft). However, a distance of 12.19m (40ft) should also be marked so that any pitchers who are 13 or 14 years of age may pitch from the 40ft distance BUT will not be considered for selection as a pitcher in the QRSS Softball State Team if pitching from the shorter distance.
- Points shall be awarded as follows:
 - Win 3 points
 - o Draw 2 points
 - o Loss 1 point
 - o Forfeit 0 points
- If two or more teams have gained an equal number of points, placings shall be decided in the following order by:
 - Percentages (Runs scored against/defensive innings played)
 - The result of the game played between the two teams





- o Runs for/offensive innings played
- The toss of a coin
- The first named team in all matches will occupy first base bench and call the toss.
- In order to speed up play, a runner may enter the game to replace the catcher on base when there are two outs. That runner can be anyone in the playing line up that is not in the next four batters. Using a runner for the catcher does not constitute as a substitution.
- A "Designated Runner", referred to as a "DR", may be used for any baserunner once only in any
 offensive innings, provided it is made known prior to the start of the game and the player's name is
 indicated on the line-up sheet:
 - The "DR" may be used as a substitute for any fielder or batter during the game, and/or
 - The "DR" may be substituted for at any time by a player who then becomes the "DR". The substitute must be a player who has not been in the game
 - o If at the time of the "DR" entering the game as a substitute a replacement "DR" is not named, the position of "DR" shall lapse.
- The designated enclosed fence distances will be within the range of 200–225ft. The exceptions to this will be in the advent of a pre-existing fence. In this case the fence will remain and the enclosed fence distance will be as exists. Should a fence not be erected for the championships, and where it is possible for all diamonds to have the same unobstructed playing surface an open diamond will be played. However, should an open diamond be obstructed, all diamonds are to have a marked boundary and a ground rule double shall apply for balls which are hit through this boundary.
- Rule 6 Section 8 Intentional Walk as detailed in the SAL Rulebook will not apply in this competition.
- In all games the batting team may declare an innings closed. This rule can only be invoked when coaches from both teams agree that it is in the best interests of the game.
- No metal cleats, steel studs or screws are permitted.

Interruption of games:

- For all interrupted games, the recommencement of play will be from the point of the interruption unless determined otherwise by the Disputes Committee.
- If a regulation game of three innings OR a minimum of one hour has been completed, the game will not be recommenced unless time within the normal allocated timeframe permits.
- In the event of a protest, the umpire will note the time taken for the protest to be heard and decided. This time will be added to the finishing time for the game to ensure full time allocation for the game.
- In the event of an injury to a player extending beyond five minutes, the umpire will note the time taken for the treatment of the injury. This time will be added to the finishing time for the game to ensure the full-time allocation for the game.
- If the injury time extends beyond 15 minutes, the Tournament Chief Umpire may declare the game to be an 'Interrupted Game'

Umpires:

 Regions are invited to bring student officials to participate. i.e. umpires. It is the policy of Queensland Representative School Sport to encourage suitable qualified student umpires to participate at this level as this provides another avenue for sport education.

Team Officials:

All team officials' names and their position/s in the team must be listed on the official team list and
ratified by the respective Regional Sports Officer prior to the commencement of the Championships.
All regional team officials will be presented to the pre championship meeting by the Convenor for the
meeting's endorsement. Only officials listed on this team list are permitted to sit on the bench and to
take part in the game.

Championship Draw:





- The championship draw will be finalised by the QRSS Softball 10-19yrs Sport Executive and forwarded to the RSSO and convenor for dissemination via bulletin to the participating teams.
- Where 12 or 11 regions are competing, the draw will be constructed about two pools, determined by the serpentine method from the final placings in the championships of the previous year.

- Teams will play a round robin within their pool and at the completion of these games will be placed
 - o Championship Pool consisting of the top three teams of each preliminary pool and
 - Placing Pool consisting of the bottom five or six teams (dependent on the number of competing regions).
- Both pools will then play a new round robin with no carry –over points from the preliminary rounds.
- The two teams placed highest within the Championship Pool (determined with reference to Rule 3.2.1.6) will play a Grand Final to determine the Champion Team.
- If the Championship or Placing Pools are cancelled, the winner will be determined by the results of the single-round robin or an amended competition.
- Where 10 regions are competing, a full round robin will be played.
 - At the completion of the round robin Semi Finals will be played: 1 v 4 and 2 v 3. A Grand Final will then be played between the winning teams of each semi-final.
 - If the round robin is incomplete, the winner will be determined by the results at the completion of the amended competition, with reference to the following:
 - a minimum of five completed rounds by all regions must have been completed. In order to achieve this the following will apply:
 - abandoned rounds will be postponed initially and may be rescheduled if time allows (additional time slots may be considered if possible at the venue)
 - should it be necessary to use the semi-final and grand final time slots to achieve the minimum number of completed rounds, this will receive priority.
 - If 5–9 rounds have been completed, and the semi-final and grand finals abandoned, the champions and runners up will be determined with reference to: Points shall be awarded as follows:
 - Win 2 points
 - Draw 1 point Loss 0 points
 - If two or more teams have gained an equal number of points, placings shall be decided by:
 - i) Percentages (Runs scored against/defensive innings played)
 - ii) The result of the game played between the two teams
 - iii) Runs for/offensive innings played
 - iv) The toss of a coin
- If, due to the loss of a significant portion of the competition on days one and two to inclement weather, it is evident that sufficient rounds may not be completed to achieve an outcome as stipulated; therefore, the championship and placing pools (as determined from previous year's placings) will be played for the remaining rounds of the championship, to enable a State Team to be selected
- Where fewer than 10 regions are competing, a full round robin will be played and a final series will be designed to include additional games to make best use of available time. A Grand Final will then be played between the two highest ranked teams to conclude the tournament.





QRSS-SE Golden Glove Softball Challenge (13-19yrs) Eligibility:

- This competition is Open division (13-19yrs) Boys and Girls team from all affiliated schools.
- No mixed gender teams permitted.

Team Competition:

- Teams are restricted to 14 players on the day of competition.
- All players must be full time bona fide secondary students who must be under 20 years of age at 31 December of year of competition.
- All players must wear the correct school softball uniform or sports uniform.

Competition Rules:

- The competition will be played under current ISF rules and Interpretations unless otherwise stated below.
- All matches will be of 1 hour 15 minutes duration or a regulation game of seven innings, whichever is arrived at first. However, an innings once started must be completed. An innings cannot be commenced within five minutes of the scheduled finishing time of the game i.e., after the 1 hour 10 minute mark.
- A game that is tied at the end of seven innings or at the end of a completed innings at the end of 1
 hour 15 minutes shall be continued by playing additional tie breaker innings.
- Declaration in all games the batting team may declare their innings closed. This declaration may be made for each innings if so desired.
- "Designated Runner", referred to as a "DR", may be used for any baserunner once only in any
 offensive innings, provided it is made known prior to the start of the game and the player's name is
 indicated on the line-up sheet.
- The "DR" may be used as a substitute for any fielder or batter during the game, and/or
- The "DR" may be substituted for at any time by a player who then becomes the "DR". The substitute must be a player who has not been in the game.
- If at the time of the "DR" entering the game as a substitute a replacement "DR" is not named, the position of "DR" shall lapse.
- Pitching distances are:
 - o Girls 40ft (12.19m)
 - o Boys 46ft (14.02m)

Tie breaker rules:

- Starting at the top of the next innings, the offensive team shall begin its turn at bat with the player who is scheduled to bat ninth in that innings i.e., the last player 'out', being placed on second base. The same is repeated at the bottom of the innings for the other team. The game is continued in this way for additional innings until a result is reached.
- Each game must have a result. No drawn games.
- No metal cleats or shoes are permitted.
- Each school will supply one regulation leather softball (in suitable condition) for each game. All regulation equipment (this includes leggings for all catchers) must be used during the game.
- Games should be controlled by official 'badged' umpires where possible. The home (non-travelling) team should arrange for the supply of umpires.
- Umpires are responsible for keeping the match time and score.
- The official team sheet, as supplied by the organising committee, must be used for all matches. The
 completed score sheet, signed by both schools, must be faxed to the Convenor within three days of
 the completion of the game





Structure of Competition:

- All schools which nominate will be organised according to Education Queensland's regions as near as possible.
- Within each region there will be a competition organised on a single elimination knockout basis.
- In special circumstances the organising committee will organise a one day round robin tournament to decide the winner for that region or zone.
- The organising committee will arrange the draw.
- Matches in each round must be played by the nominated date. Failure to do so may result in exclusion from the competition.

Match Venues and times

- For all matches up to but excluding the finals series, the venue is to be arranged by mutual agreement. If schools cannot mutually agree, the organising committee will arbitrate.
- After the first round, the school which has travelled most in that round will be deemed, in most cases, to be the home team.
- All matches are to be arranged at a time mutually acceptable to both schools. In most cases this will be outside school hours. Where school time is available, it must be with the approval of both principals.
- School convenors are asked to contact the local Softball Association for assistance in relation to umpires and/or facilities. A list of Association contacts is provided to each competing school.

Responsibilities:

School Responsibilities

- The competition will be known as the Golden Glove Softball Challenge (herein referred to as 'The Challenge').
- All efforts must be made by team officials to seek publicity in the local press and softball publications.
- A team nomination entry fee will be paid to enter the Challenge. This payment is to be determined by the QRSS-SE Golden Glove organising sub-committee and payment will be made to the QRSS-SE prior to commencement of the Challenge.
- All payments must be received prior to the Regional Competition Day.

Organising Committee Responsibilities Trophies

- Golden Glove Softball Challenge winning teams (i.e., girls and boys) will receive a trophy.
- The winning school in each area will receive an appropriate memento of their participation in the Final Series.
- Players in all participating teams will be presented with a certificate.

Appendix 7 – Sport Specific Selection Processes

Process

Prior to the Championship

- Queensland Representative School Sport (QRSS) 10-19 Years Softball Executive advertises for Team Official positions.
- Successful applicants must complete the mandatory training prior to the State Championship.
- QRSS 10-19 Years Softball Executive will communicate the Chair of Selectors to each region.
- Regions will send the final team lists to the Chair of Selectors.
- As part of Bulletin 2, Regions will request nominations for the panel of selectors.
- Chair of selectors will complete the selectors booklet for distribution at the Pre-Championship meeting.
- At the Championship
- Chair of selectors establishes a roster for each game.
- At least one member of the selection panel must be present for each game where possible.
- Each panel member must attempt to see part of each of the games or every team on at least four different occasions (draw permitting).
- Regional team officials must be consulted with regarding selection on the first two days of the championship collectively.
- Notes must be kept for each athlete wishing to be selected.

Schedule

Pre-Championship Meeting

- Meet and discuss the selection booklet.
- Establish the criteria.
- Discuss the roster for each game.

Day 1

- Game observations.
- Regional team officials' consultation meeting at the end of the day.
- Preliminary selection meeting with the panel post last game.
- Presentation of preliminary list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member.
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and regional team officials.

Day 2

- · Game observations.
- Regional team officials' consultation meeting at the end of the day.
- Selection meeting post last game.
- Presentation of revised list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and regional team officials.

Day 3

- Game observations.
- Regional team official consultation request only.
- Presentation of final list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member.
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and regional team officials.

<u>Day 4</u>

Prior to the Grand Final, the final team selection is made.





Selection Criteria

The following factors will be considered for players wishing to be selected in the Queensland Representative School Sport Team.

- Sport Specific Skills
- Attitude and Coachability
- Communication
- Problem solving
- Team work

Sport Specific Skills: Relevant to a position. Skills specific to a position as well as general skills. There are a limited number of spots available in each position. Players are selected to best fill team requirements in a position. Relevant attributes relating to the sport and position i.e.: power, running, strength, accuracy, agility, etc.

Attitude and Coachability: Positive, committed and focused players. The player pays attention, listens to the coach and apply instructions. As players develop, their roles on the team become more defined. Teams are selected to maximize the development of players into their roles.

Communication: Contributes to a positive team environment through the appropriate use of language towards teammates. Articulates direction on court or field of play when necessary.

Problem Solving: Initiation of change and demonstration of solutions relating to the following when relevant:

- Selecting or communicating to team member/s appropriate strategy.
- Selecting or communicating to team member/s appropriate strategy that affords in attack or defence.
- Initiating change in body position and or court position and or speed of play to improve success in defence and or success and accuracy of passing and or shot selection and or to deceive the opposition.
- Initiating change in offensive and or defensive situations to counter strengths in the opposition.
- Providing solutions to elicit change in team performance (e.g., communicating feedback or advice).

Team Work: Demonstration of leadership, fair play and cooperation.
