## Sport Competition Guidelines

## Minimum Venue Standards

The host region venue must comply with audit requirements and:

- complete a procurement process (where required).
- have sufficient and suitable (e.g. cabin/motel style) accommodation within the host town/city to provide places for all visiting parents/supporters competitors/ student officials/team officials
- have access to appropriate transport to/from the host town/city
- have access/proximity to 24 hour medical services (e.g. hospital, ambulance, dentist, physio)
- The playing venue must be a suitable standard and must comply with the sport specific minimum requirements. Consideration must also be given to factors such as:
o sufficient number of suitably sized change rooms present
o spectators must be adequately catered for with suitable viewing, toilet facilities, canteen etc.
o Competition Area - Field of Play/number of courts or fields required
o Suitable shade \& shelter for hot \& wet weather if necessary
o Access to water
o Officials' Room with secure area for official's bags
o Championship working group control room
- Access to internet
- Laptop and printer
- Photocopier
- Paper
- General stationery


## First Aid

A minimum of two First Aid Officers/Sports Trainers must be provided each day of competition. Any child treated must be accompanied by a Team Official or parent.

## Spectator's facilities

Ensure there is sufficient shade, seating, toilets facilities, food and drinks vendors.

## Officials

It is preferable that all key officials have a minimum Level accreditation and first aid/CPR. The key officials are (but not limited to):

- Tournament Director
- Technical Convenor
- Chief Referee

Additional officials required (list individually)
Student Officials - insert QRSS 'categories'

## Equipment

- The Host Region must supply all equipment for the safe conduct of the Championships.
- All equipment must comply with sport specific requirements
- Other necessary equipment is:
- Competition Software (if applicable)
- Access Passes (if applicable)

Competition areas must be checked each day for potential hazards and steps must be taken to rectify or make safe these potential hazards.

## Duration and Draws

Duration of championships are to be scheduled to use no more than two school days for competition. Where this cannot occur, the Host Region will communicate with the QRSS - RC and QRSS for approval and endorsement.

Such issues may include:

- availability of venues,
- number of games played per day etc

At each State Championship for team sports, the draw must ensure that all teams play on each day of the event.

At each State Championship a Queensland team may be selected and named (as a travelling or merit team). No other teams are to be named.

The sport specific competition procedures outline the draws and round robin matches to be played for various formats.

- In the case of uneven numbers, the host region shall be given the second option of providing another regional team.
- Queensland Touch Football will able to provide support for our 10-18 Years State Championship events.
- Promotion of Coach Support opportunities to access QTF Coach Developer program.
- Coach Support - Opportunity for coaches to access QTF Coach Developer program; pre and during QRSS Touch Competitions. Target less experienced coaches.
- Advise QRSS Touch Competitions dates, once finalised and published, for QTF to publish and promote.
- Advise QRSS Touch Competitions Daily Results and Final Results table for QTF to publish and promote.

| Spectator's facilities | - The Ground Manager and Convenor are responsible for ensuring the safety of players and officials. <br> - Parents - Parents are not permitted to enter the field of play. <br> o If no fence at the venue, parents and spectators are to remain an adequate distance from the boundary of the field as requested by the Ground Manager. |

## Championship Rules and Guidelines

## 10-12 Years Girls, 10-12 Years Boys

The 10-12 Years Queensland Representative School Sport Touch State Championships shall use the same Championship Rules and Guidelines except for the conditions set out below:

- The regions will play a full round robin with teams being ranked in order on the completion of this competition. All matches will be 15 minutes each way with a five minute half time. There will be no time off for injury.
- If a player is sent off (not a period of time) in any game, his/her penalty shall be decided by the Championship Committee. There shall be no right of appeal of the decision of this committee.
- Teams are to be dressed and ready to play at least 10 minutes before their match is due to start.
- The top two teams will then progress to the Grand Final. The Grand Final will be 15 minutes each way with a five-minute break for half time and no time off for injury.
- The draw is determined each year by the playing venue and how many fields are available.
- If a bye exists, the option is provided to the host Region to enter two teams.
- The draw has been designed on a number system where the previous year's result is your allocated number for the following year. Each year the draw is reviewed to consider changes.
- Match points during the round robin series will be as follows:
o Win 3 points
o Draw 2 points
o Loss 1 point
o Forfeit 0 points
- If, after the round robin series points are equal, the following will be used to separate teams on equal points for a place in the Grand Final:
o Difference for minus against
o Percentage for divided by against $\times 100$
o Round game result


## Shoot Out

- At the conclusion of the round robin matches the teams whom are not contesting the final will participate in a Shoot Out. (See Appendix B)
- If teams are still equal a five minute game will be played. If no result after the five minutes a drop off will then be played.
- A drop off (following current TFA rules) will be played in the Grand Final if there is no result. Drop off will be two-minute intervals.
- Sub boxes will be used in all games. Coaching is only permissible from the sub box. Coaches may take up position behind either score-line but must remain quiet. This rule applies to all team participants and the referee may ask for the removal of any person contravening this rule.
- In the event of inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances which may affect the program, the QRSS 10-12 Years Touch shall follow the policy below:
o Situation 1: If Round games are incomplete and no further play is possible.
- Decision - Championship cancelled and State squads selected by selectors in consultation with Regional Coaches. No State Champions awarded
o Situation 2: If Round games completed and no more play possible.
- Decision - Place awarded as per points table.
o Situation 3: If Round games are incomplete and limited play available.
- Considerations/Options - Shorten Games, day of competition cancelled, alternative venue and fields available.

- If a player is sent off permanently from a game for any misdemeanour, the Tournament Committee will decide his/her penalty. There is no appeal over the decision of this Committee.


## 13-15 Years Boys, 13-15 Years Girls, 16-18 Years Girls, 16-18 Years Boys

- The rules of touch as set down by Touch Football Australia (current edition) will be used unless stated otherwise below.
- All preliminary rounds (day 1) and ranking games (day 2 and 3) leading up to the quarter finals will be 15 minutes each way, with a five-minute half-time break.
- All "finals series" games (i.e. quarter finals, semi-finals and the grand finals) will be twenty minutes each way, with a five minute break at half time, and no time off for injury.
- Coaching is only permissible from the sub box. Coaches may take up position behind either score-line but must remain quiet. This rule applies to all team participants and the referee may ask for the removal of any person contravening this rule
- If a player is sent off (not a period of time) in any game, his/her penalty shall be decided by the Championship Committee. There shall be no right of appeal of the decision of this committee.
- Schools / Teams / or individuals who breach any of the above conditions / rules, or the Qld School Sport Codes of Conduct, shall be disqualified and banned from further "ALL SCHOOLS" Championships.
o (Note - all penalties carry over to affiliated community, regional, State Touch competitions throughout Australia).
- Preliminary rounds and Ranking games will be 15 minutes each way, with a five (5) minute half time break.
- The teams shall play a Preliminary Round competition in three (3) Pools with the teams being seeded based on the final finishing positions from the last 3 QRSS Touch State Championships. The teams shall be placed in Pools as follows:
- Teams finishing: 1st, 6th, 7th, 12th in Pool A, Teams finishing: 2nd, 5th, 8th, 11th in Pool B, Teams finishing: 3rd, 4th, 9th, 10th in Pool C
- At the completion of the Preliminary rounds, the teams shall be ranked according to the match points gained. Teams shall progress to either the "A Series" (first two ranked teams in each pool) or the "B Series" (the teams ranked 3 and 4 in each pool).
"A" Series
- Teams shall play five Ranking Games against the other teams in the "A" Series to determine their ranking from $1-6$. The preliminary game result from day 1 against another region that also progressed through to the "A" series will be used as a ranking game score. No region will play against the same region twice in the preliminary or ranking games.
- Teams that finish the ranking games in positions $1-6$ will go into a quarter final series.
- Following the ranking games, the first (1) ranked team will play eighth (8) in Quarter Final 1. Second (2) will play seventh (7) in Quarter Final 2. Third (3) will play sixth (6) in Quarter Final 3 and fourth (4) will play fifth (5) in Quarter Final 4. Positions seven (7) and (8) for the quarter finals will be allocated to the top two (2) teams from the "B" series.
- All Quarter Final winners will progress through to the Trophy Series. All Quarter Finals runners up will progress through to the Plate Series.
- TROPHY Series Semi Final No. 1 (Field 1) winner Quarter Final 1 v winner Quarter Final 4
- TROPHY Series Semi Final No. 2 (Field 2) winner Quarter Final 2 v winner Quarter Final 3
- PLATE Series Semi Final No. 1 (Field 1) runners up Quarter Final 1 v runners up Quarter Final 4
- PLATE Series Semi Final No. 2 (Field 2) runners up Quarter Final 2 v runners up Quarter Final 3


## B" Series

- Teams shall play five Ranking Games against the other teams in the "B" Series to determine their ranking from $7-12$. The preliminary game result from day 1 against another region that also

progressed through to the "B" series will be used as a ranking game score. No region will play against the same region twice in the preliminary (day 1) or ranking games (day 2,3).

- Following the ranking games, the seventh (7) ranked team will play second
(2) in Quarter Final 2. Eighth (8) will play first (1) in Quarter Final 1.
- Teams that finish "B" series ranking games in positions $9-12$ will go straight into the Bowl Series.
- BOWL Series Semi Final No. 1 (Field 1) team ranked 9 v team ranked 12 BOWL Series Semi Final No. 2 (Field 2) team ranked 10 v team ranked 11
- Match Points (during Round Robin Series) shall be awarded as follows:
Win 3 pts

Draw 2 pts
Loss $\quad 1 \mathrm{pt}$
Forfeit 0 pts

- If after the preliminary rounds (day 1 ) are completed and points are the same for 2 teams that are tied for second position, then the following general rule shall apply:

Round game result
o Best difference (For minus against)
o Best percentage (For divided by against, multiplied by 100)
o Drop off

- If after the preliminary rounds (day 1) are completed and points are equal for 3 teams that have tied for first or second place, the following rule shall apply:
o Three teams are equal first in a pool. The following shall apply - they shall be separated using differences then percentages. If percentages are equal then a drop off shall be used.
o Three teams are equal second in a pool. The following shall apply - the team with the best differences, then percentages, shall progress directly to the " $A$ " series ranking games. The remaining two teams will move into the " B " series.
- Team Registration Forms must be completed prior to the first round and submitted to the tournament administration.
- The QRSS 10-18 years Touch Football Committee accepts no claim for any injuries sustained by the participants or loss of personal property. Participants are encouraged to take out the relevant insurances.
- In the event of inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances which may affect the program, the QRSS 10-18 years Touch Football shall follow the policy below:
0 Situation 1: If Preliminary games (day 1) are incomplete and no further play is possible.
- Decision - Championship cancelled and State squads selected by selectors in consultation with regional coaches. Rankings remain same for next year's Championships.
o Situation 2: If ranking (day 2, 3) games are incomplete and limited play available.
- Decision - Complete rounds. First ranked teams play off in final. Cross pool ranking games for all other places. State squads selected as above.
o Situation 3: If preliminary games completed and no more play possible.
- Decision - as in 1. above.
o Situation 4: If preliminary games (day 1 ) are completed and limited time available.
- Decision - Reduce playoffs to final four (trophy only). Cross pool ranking games for all other places. State teams selected as per selection policy.

## Extra Information/offences

- At all times, the rescheduling of games and the Tournament in general, will be determined by the QRSS 10-18 years Touch Football Executive, in consultation with the host Region, and the Convenor.
- QRSS 10-18 years Touch Football reserves the right to interpret the above conditions in the interests of all participants, should the situation warrant.

2. Successful applicants must complete the mandatory training prior to the State Championship
3. QRSS will communicate the Chair of Selectors to each region
4. Host Region will send the final team lists to the Chair of Selectors
5. As part of bulletin 2, Regions will request nominations for the panel of selectors
6. Chair of selectors will complete the selectors booklet for distribution at the Pre-Championship meeting

## At the Championship

1. Chair of selectors establishes a roster for each game
2. At least one member of the selection panel must be present for each game
3. Each panel member must attempt to see part of each of the games (draw permitting)
4. Regional team officials must be consulted daily regarding selection
5. Notes must be kept for each athlete wishing to be selected

## Pre-Championship meeting

- Meet and discuss the selection booklet
- Establish the criteria
- Discuss the roster for each game


## Day 1

- Game observations
- Regional team official consultation
- Preliminary selection meeting with the panel post last game
- Presentation of preliminary list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and Regional team officials


## Day 2

- Game observations
- Regional team official consultation
- Selection meeting post last game
- Presentation of revised list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and Regional team officials


## Day 3

- Game observations
- Regional team official consultation
- Presentation of final list of possible and probable athletes from each panel member
- Discussion regarding feedback from game observation and Regional team officials

Day 4
Prior to the Grand Final, the final team selection is made

## Sport Specific Selection Processes

- Selectors shall meet on a regular basis on each day of the competition.
- Selectors shall follow the selection procedures as outlined in the Selectors booklet. This booklet shall be maintained as a written record of observations and assessments, and as such shall be retained by the QRSS Touch at the conclusion of the Championships.
- Provision shall be made for team Coaches to provide information to Selectors where applicable. Selectors may obtain a verbal or written report from team Coaches regarding their player's performances, should they feel it necessary.
- Selectors will be allocated to all games (preliminary, ranking and finals games), however subsequent allocations shall be at the discretion of the State Selectors.
- Any 'deadlocks' shall be decided by the Queensland Coach.
- Selectors shall not discuss the progress of Selections with any individual outside the Panel.

Below is a brief overview of the procedure to be used for selection. The State Coach is the chairperson and shall lead all discussions. Meeting times will be advised by the State Coach.

- Selectors follow as close as possible their roster. (in the case of selectors who are also Coaches, they may leave games at their discretion to prepare their teams etc.) The State coach will organize the roster for all selectors.
- All selectors complete the "Player Identification Game Sheet" as they identify 'state team prospects' from games viewed. Only potential State standard players should be recorded on this sheet. (Notes about player's strengths and weaknesses should be recorded here as well as a rating out of 10 for each game performance. See Ratings table below)
- At the first meeting, (advised by the State Coach or Chair) an Initial Player list is created using the "Identified Players - Summary Sheet". These are all players who have performed well in the round games. Once this list is completed, no player can be added at a later date. (In other words, all players must have performed consistently in these early games)
- Once this list is established all selectors then 'target' these players in ensuing games.
- At the second meeting, selectors may commence to move players whose performances have been consistent and or outstanding across to the Secondary List for closer inspection.
- It shall also be possible to confirm 'certainty' players whose performances have been outstanding, and, consequently as a group the selectors may decide to move these players (usually very few) into the team. This can save valuable time, enabling selectors to concentrate on the 'fringe' players.
- During the Finals series (including ranking games), player comparisons can take place and selectors can now work together to cover all games with the priority being those games of a 'higher' standard and games where a number of candidate players are performing.
- At the Final meeting (held prior to the Final) the majority of players should have been agreed upon. The Final may be used to make any final decisions between one or two players who may well be in the Grand Final teams.
- The selectors are at liberty to review, change, or otherwise amend decisions which have been made right up to the end of discussions. For example, circumstances may change. I.e. a player may be sent off, another may lose form markedly or struggle in the pressure games in the Finals Series, or a player may be found guilty of a breach of the Code of Conduct. Any changes are only applicable to the certainty players, and does not include the inclusion of 'new' players, not on the Initial Player List.
- All selections shall be ratified by the QRSS Touch Executive prior to announcement by the State Coach.
